What to Expect

Exam 230/240 is a non-proctored assessment. You take it online, at a time and location of your choosing.

The assessment is entirely administered by the computer. Before the assessment starts, you will see several instruction screens. These screens explain how to use the computer to take the test.

Exam 230/240 is not timed, however it should take you less than 30 minutes to complete. If you need to stop the assessment partway through, you will pick up where you left off when you log back in. While the time that you take to complete the assessment is up to you, you must finish the assessment by the day specified in your e-mail invitation.

Once you have completed the assessment, you will receive an e-mail message with instructions on how to access your results.

Preparing for the Assessment

Read all the information in this package. Take the assessment at a time when you are physically and mentally prepared.

It is suggested that you set aside a quiet time and place with limited distractions to complete the assessment. The assessment is designed to be taken without interruptions or breaks.

Obligation to Provide Reasonable Accommodation for Qualified Applicants with a Disability

The United States Postal Service is obligated under Section 501 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, found in 29 U.S.C. § 791 *et seq.* to provide accommodations to a qualified applicant with a disability that will enable the individual to have an equal opportunity to participate in the application process and to be considered for a job.

Persons who believe that they have a disability requiring accommodation for the assessment may use assistive aids that are needed for work on a computer (for example, a large screen reader). They must, however, complete the assessment themselves.

Frequently Asked Questions

How long will it take to get the assessment results?

A Notice of Result will be available on the assessment site as soon as you finish the assessment.

What is a passing score?

You must attain a minimum score of 70 (excluding Veterans' Preference points) on the examination to be considered for any of the positions for which you applied.

How long are the results of the test valid?

Your examination result is valid through the expiration date shown on your Notice of Result.

If you are an applicant, your results will be maintained in your eCareer Candidate Profile and will be automatically included with your application if you apply for other USPS vacancies requiring this exam.

If you are an employee, your test result may be valid for longer, based on your situation and in accordance with Postal policy.

I'd like to know what questions I answered wrong so that I can study for the next time. Where can I get that information?

That information will not be provided. The only feedback you will receive is the information on your Notice of Result.

Examination Content

Test Instructions

Read all instructions very carefully. The assessment consists of 18 items. During the actual assessment, you will select your response to each item by clicking the arrow button and selecting the answer from a drop down menu. Some questions will ask you to type your answer in the space provided.

Test Questions

Each of the assessment items ask about your driving experience. When completing the examination, your responses must be truthful, complete, and correct to the best of knowledge, and made in good faith. Any false information provided is grounds for disqualification or removal from employment with the U.S. Postal Service. Driver records are checked prior to hire.

Item Types

There are two types of response formats on Exam 230/240.

- Multiple choice, select one. These self-report items ask you about your driving history and experience.
- Fill in the blank. These self-report items ask you about your driving history and experience concerning violations and accidents. You must enter your responses in whole numbers (For example: 0, 1, 2, 3, etc.).

Scoring

Your Notice of Result will let you know if you are eligible for Motor Vehicle Operator and Tractor Trailer Operator jobs. Different questions contribute to these two result calculations.
