How to Ship a USPS Operation Santa® Package





Go shopping for the gift and keep the following tips in mind:

- You don't need to get everything the child asks for
- Larger and heavier items are more expensive to ship
- Using Priority Mail[®] flat rate boxes helps keep postage costs low
- You can always give a gift card



Wrap the gift, put the person's name on it, and put it in the box with the Note from Santa that came in your confirmation packet. Seal the package.



Take the box to a Post Office[™] location. Ship early so the gift can be delivered in time.



Give the retail associate the box and the QR Code^{®1} from the Adoption Confirmation Packet. The QR Code^{®1} can be printed or just shown on your phone.



The clerk will calculate postage. You need to pay postage to ship the gift.



A shipping label will be placed on the box. You will not see it for privacy reasons.



You also will not be given tracking information for privacy reasons, but you will be notified when the package has shipped.
