Two of the five classic shirts depicted in the stamp art showcase surfers and the fossil fish, shells, and sea stars; another shows a bird of paradise flower; and or volcano. Manufacturer **Alfred Shaheen** created four of the shirts depicted on th surfers and their classic early boards on a black background; the bird of paradis carrying the private label of the retailer Watumull's and Leilani—the shirt depicting shells, and sea stars. The red shirt showing surfers and a large wave was manufact director **Carl Herrman** designed these stamps using photos by Noyle.
