Key officer positions filled; Human Resources, Labor Relations realigned: Vegliante, Tulino, LaChance, Galligan and Brennan named to positions

Postmaster General (PMG) Jack Potter has named five individuals to key officer positions in Human Resources (HR) and Operations. The appointments coincide with a realignment of HR and Labor Relations functions.

“As we work toward the creation of the *Strategic Transformation Plan 2006–2010*,” Potter said, “it is critical that we have the leadership and processes in place that will assist us in our goals of increasing operational efficiency, improving service and continuing to enhance a customer-focused, performance-based culture.”

The PMG named *Tony Vegliante*, currently vice president, Labor Relations, to serve as chief Human Resources officer and executive vice president. He will be a member of the executive committee and report to the postmaster general.

Doug Tulino, manager, Labor Relations Policy and Programs, has been named acting vice president, Labor Relations, reporting to the chief Human Resources officer.

Susan LaChance will serve as the new Human Resources vice president for Employee Development and Diversity. In her new role, she will be responsible for employee and leadership development, succession planning, equal employment opportunity and diversity.

Rounding out the new Human Resources team is *DeWitt Harris*, vice president of Employee Resource Management. Harris has been instrumental in driving workplace improvements as measured by key indicators such as reductions in Occupational Safety and Health Administration illness and injury rates and the positive results of the Voice of the Employee survey. “We look forward to DeWitt’s continued leadership in this role as he places an increased focus on the development and rollout of the Human Resources Shared Services initiative, PostalPEOPLE,” Potter said.

William Galligan, the new senior vice president of Operations, will have responsibility for Engineering, Facilities and Network Operations Management, as well as Delivery and Retail. He will report to Deputy Postmaster General and Chief Operating Officer Pat Donahoe.

Megan Brennan will serve as Northeast Area vice president. Brennan has responsibility for all retail, mail processing, delivery and administrative operations for 3,000 Postal Service™ facilities serving 20 million customers in a seven-state area. Brennan also reports to Donahoe.

“Each of these individuals, through a combination of experience, education and outstanding performance, have demonstrated their unique qualifications for these key leadership positions as we continue to move the Postal Service™ forward,” Potter said.

USPS and U.S. Army join forces

BDS installations ahead of schedule

A state-of-the-art biohazard detection system (BDS) is well on its way to full deployment at USPS processing and distribution centers (PDCs). So far, 114 PDCs have BDS units installed — state-of-the-art, self-contained and fully automated devices that protect the public and Postal Service employees from biohazards. The installation has been so successful that the planned deployment to all 282 PDCs nationwide is being accelerated, with a target deadline of December 2005.

Tracking international forgers

More than 3,700 counterfeit postal money orders were intercepted from October to December, exceeding the total for the previous 12 months, according to the Postal Inspection Service, with most of the forgeries originating in Nigeria, Ghana and Eastern Europe. Inspectors are warning financial institutions to be vigilant and are working to intercept packages containing bogus money orders as they enter the country. Arrests of 160 individuals have been made in the United States. 286.1 Postmaster General

- a. Deputy postmaster general and chief operating officer.
- b. Vice president, area operations, eastern area.
- c. Vice president, area operations, western area.

ALL OFFICES WITH CITY MOTORIZED, RURAL, AND HIGHWAY CONTRACT BOX DELIVERY ROUTES

Mailbox Improvement Week, May 16–22

Each year, the Postal Service™ designates the third full week of May to encourage customers on city motorized, rural, or highway contract box delivery routes to examine and, where necessary, improve the appearance of their mailboxes. Neat, attractive mailboxes make a significant contribution to the appearance of the countryside and to streets in suburban areas. Mailbox Improvement Week, May 16–22, calls attention to the need for providing mailboxes that are:

1. Approved by the postmaster general.
2. Designed to protect the mail from weather.
3. Safe to use.
4. Conveniently located.
5. Neat in appearance.

Mailboxes that meet these five important requirements help delivery and collection operations and improve service to the entire route. There are three approved styles of curbside mailboxes: (1) traditional design, in three standard sizes (see Exhibit A on page 8); (2) contemporary design, also in three sizes (see Exhibit B on page 8); and (3) locked, full- or limited-service. USPS STD 7B governs the design and specifications of curbside mailboxes and includes provisions for improved quality of the product.

Notice 209

Postmasters should send Notice 209, *Mailbox Improvement Week*, to all rural and highway contract box delivery route customers the week before Mailbox Improvement Week to alert them of the event.

Ordering Procedures:

City Motorized, Rural, and Highway Contract Box Delivery Routes

Customers must use *only* approved traditional, contemporary, or locked full- or limited-service curbside mailboxes for new installations or replacements. Postmasters should ensure that where new delivery is established or extended, customers use delivery equipment approved by the postmaster general. However, an individual customer may use a custom-built curbside mailbox if the local postmaster gives prior approval and the mailbox conforms generally to the same requirements as approved manufactured curbside mailboxes relative to the flag, size, strength, and quality of construction. Carriers on motorized city routes may continue to serve mailboxes that are designed primarily for use by customers receiving door delivery and that have been erected and served under previous regulations (see Exhibit C on this page). However, carriers should advise customers that they may use only approved curbside mailboxes when replacing these types of mailboxes. A list of approved manufacturers of traditional curbside mailboxes appears on pages 10–11.

For motorized city routes, and where the use of street names and house numbers is authorized on rural and highway contract box delivery routes, the mailbox must display the number on the side of single mailboxes or on the door of grouped mailboxes. If the mailbox is on a street other than the one on which the customer resides, the street name and house number must be on the mailbox. When rural and highway contract box delivery route customers have assigned box numbers, the numbers must appear on the side of single mailboxes or on the doors of grouped

mailboxes, visible to the approaching carrier. The street number, box number, and/or any other address information must be inscribed in contrasting color in neat letters and numerals not less than 1 inch in height. In all instances, placing the owner's name on the box is optional.

Motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery route customers are encouraged, but not required, to group mailboxes whenever practical, especially where many mailboxes are located at or near crossroads, service turnouts, or similar locations. Customers should also paint mailboxes and supports/posts and keep them rust-free. Advertising on mailboxes and mailbox supports is prohibited.

In areas where snow removal is a problem, the Postal Service suggests using a semi-arch or extended arm-type support (see Exhibit D), which allows snowplows to sweep near or under mailboxes without damaging supports and provides easy access to the mailboxes by carriers and customers.

Generally, mailboxes should be installed at a height of 41–45 inches from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or point of mail entry. Mailboxes are set back 6–8 inches from the front face of the curb or road edge to the mailbox door. However, because of varying road and curb conditions and other factors, the Postal Service recommends that customers contact their local Post Office™ before erecting or replacing mailboxes and supports.

Location

Customers must place mailboxes on motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery routes so a carrier can safely and conveniently serve them without leaving his or her vehicle. The mailboxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the carrier's travel direction in all cases where traffic conditions make it dangerous for the carrier to drive to the left to reach the mailboxes, or where doing so would constitute a violation of traffic laws and regulations. *Postal Operations Manual*, POM, 632.6, Apartment House Receptacles, specifies Postal Service regulations regard-

ing locations for apartment houses and other multiple unit dwellings. On new rural and highway contract box delivery routes, all mailboxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of the route line of travel. Mailbox placement must conform with state laws and highway regulations. City motorized, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers are subject to the same traffic laws and regulations as other motorists. Customers must remove obstructions, including vehicles, trash cans, and snow, that impede safe and efficient delivery. Except when a mailbox is temporarily blocked, carriers must have access to the mailbox without leaving the vehicle unless authorized to dismount.

Mailbox Supports

The Postal Service does not regulate mailbox supports in any way except for purposes of carrier safety and delivery efficiency. Posts and other supports for curbside mailboxes are owned and controlled by customers, who are responsible for ensuring that posts are neat and adequate in strength and size. Heavy metal posts, concrete posts, and miscellaneous items of farm equipment, such as milk cans filled with concrete, are examples of potentially dangerous supports. The ideal support is an assembly that bends or falls away when struck by a vehicle. Post or support designs may not represent effigies or caricatures that disparage or ridicule any person. Customers may attach the box to a fixed or movable arm. POM 632.5, Curbside Mailboxes, specifies Postal Service regulations regarding construction and placement of mailboxes and supports on motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery routes.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has determined that mailbox supports no larger than 4 inches by 4 inches, or a 2-inch diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe, buried no more than 24 inches, should safely break away if struck by a vehicle. According to FHWA, the mailbox also must be securely attached to its post to prevent separation if struck. See Exhibits E (page 16) and F (page 17) for examples of mailbox mountings and supports suggested by the FHWA.

Cluster Box Units and All-Weather Parcel Lockers

During Mailbox Improvement Week, postmasters and managers or their designees must review all cluster box units (CBUs), neighborhood delivery and collection box units (NDCBUs), and outdoor parcel lockers (OPLs) in their delivery areas to identify any hazards or irregularities, and they must record the results of the review. *Note:* NDCBUs are not approved for use by Postal Service employees in new delivery or as replacement units for existing NDCBUs, even when privately purchased. Postal Service officials must not install Arrow locks in new NDCBUs or initiate delivery to NDCBUs installed as replacements.

Upon completion of the reviews, copies must be retained locally *and* consolidated copies sent to the designated growth coordinator for each district. PS Form 8143, *Equipment Checklist and Follow-up Review*, is the

suggested format to use in conducting and recording the reviews. PS Form 8143 is available in this *Postal Bulletin* (see Exhibit G on page 19) and on the Delivery and Retail/Growth Management Web page (http://blue.usps.gov/delivery/del_growth_management.htm), and must be reproduced locally. Employees conducting the reviews must complete PS Form 1624, *Delivery/Collection Equipment Work Request*, for any equipment that poses a safety hazard to Postal Service customers or employees. Requisition PS Form 1624 from the MDC using normal ordering procedures (described on page 8). The relevant ordering information for PS Form 1624 is as follows:

Equipment Review Procedure

Employees must use the CBU and parcel locker equipment checklist and follow-up review procedure when examining the condition of CBUs, NDCBUs, and OPLs. Employees must do the following:

1. List the 5-digit, USPS-marked Postal Service ID number of the unit. This is usually visible on the front or side of the body or pedestal. If a Postal Service ID number is not available, list the unit location, equipment type, and manufacturer in the left-hand column. If you are able to access the back of the unit, list the unit's vendor-supplied serial number. The type listed *must* distinguish between NDCBU and CBU.
2. Assign each checklist item one of the following ratings:
 - a. OK — Equipment does not need attention for this item.
 - b. X — Equipment needs attention for this item.
 - c. NA — Item does not apply to this particular piece of equipment.
3. When examining the equipment, use the instructions below to complete PS Form 8143:
 - a. Check equipment. All CBUs, NDCBUs, and OPLs should be straight, vertical, and firmly mounted. For safety concerns, please ensure that customer compartments are facing *away* from the street. Visually verify that four bolts/nuts are firmly in place securing the pedestal to the concrete pad and to the CBU, NDCBU, or OPL. Apply hand pressure to the top edge of the unit from the front side. While the unit may flex under the load, verify that the pedestal stays firmly mounted to the

concrete and that the unit does not separate from the pedestal. For safety concerns, please ensure that customer compartments are located such that customers do not have to stand in the street to access their mail.

- b. Check visible welds. Make note of cracked, broken, or rusted welds. For NDCBUs and OPLs only, tap the pedestal with a lightweight hammer, especially along the seams, to check for corrosion from the inside out or perforated corrosion.
 - c. For CBUs and NDCBUs, observe whether the carrier access door is locked and secure. Open it and observe whether it is bowed or warped and whether the door and locking bar operate smoothly. With the carrier access door open, check whether restraining devices prevent the door from blowing closed. These devices, which may have to be set manually, should be serviceable.
 - d. Ensure that the Arrow lock operates smoothly and easily and that the mounting hardware is tight. For NDCBUs and OPLs, the cover that protects the Arrow lock from customer tampering must be serviceable and firmly attached.
 - e. For OPLs, the cover that protects the Arrow lock from theft must be secured with the proper quantity of tamper-resistant screws.
 - f. Ensure that all customer access doors are present, closed, and locked with no visible damage or signs of forced entry. Check that customer door numbers are readable.
 - g. Ensure that the exterior surface of the unit is free from rust and graffiti.
 - h. Examine the unit. Check it for defects or damage and whether it reflects a proper Postal Service image.
 - i. Check whether the unit and/or any protecting structure appears watertight and in good repair. Check whether there are any noticeable watermarks inside the unit or any wet mail.
 - j. Note any other conditions that require attention. Also, look for signs of vandalism such as pry marks on doors and locks.
4. Record the results of the inspection on the checklist.
 5. Submit the completed PS Form 1624 for each unit reviewed to the maintenance office responsible for centralized delivery equipment installation and/or repair in the area.

Carriers must note equipment deficiencies and report them to the postmaster, supervisor, or designee. The postmaster or designee must then submit PS Form 1624 reporting the equipment defects. In addition, carriers should

complete PS Form 1767, *Report of Hazard, Unsafe Condition, or Practice*, for items that pose an immediate threat to safety, such as an improperly secured or leaning NDCBU/CBU. Order PS Form 1767 from the MDC using normal ordering procedures (described on page 8). The relevant ordering information for PS Form 1767 is as follows:

The postmaster or supervisor must immediately notify by telephone the office responsible for repair of reported hazards. The postmaster or supervisor must follow up to ensure that the work is satisfactorily completed and documented. The office responsible for repair should use its local buying authority to accomplish the repairs.

In January 1999, the Postal Service announced that NDCBUs cannot be installed for delivery of mail beginning in fiscal year 2000. As previously stated, there are no waivers granted for this policy. The contracts with American Locker Security Systems, Auth-Florence Manufacturing, and Security Manufacturing expire May 31, 2005. OPLs are available only through the national contract with American Locker. As of June 1, 2005, all orders for CBUs and OPLs must be placed against the new national contract with Auth-Florence, and all orders must be placed through eBay.

Apartment House Mail Receptacles — Horizontal and Vertical

Note: USPS has finalized a complete revision to USPS-STD-4B. The new standard is USPS-STD-4C, effective September 3, 2004.

For replacement of existing equipment, security-enhanced versions of both horizontal and vertical boxes are now available. They are referred to as "USPS-STD-4B+" boxes and are designed to fit cleanly into buildings with old USPS-STD-4B boxes.

In the very near future, a new generation of boxes will be available. The new boxes will be referred to as USPS-STD-4C boxes.

USPS-STD-4B and USPS-STD-4B+ boxes are approved for Postal Service mail *delivery* for indoor installations or protected outdoor locations. However, the Postal Service is prohibited from purchasing this equipment for apartments. You may only order *replacement parts* for Postal Service–owned equipment that was installed in the past.

Please refer to the attached timelines on page 20 for critical dates in implementation of USPS-STD-4C. If there are any additional questions regarding these timelines, please contact area or district growth coordinators for further information.

Cantilever Mailbox Supports

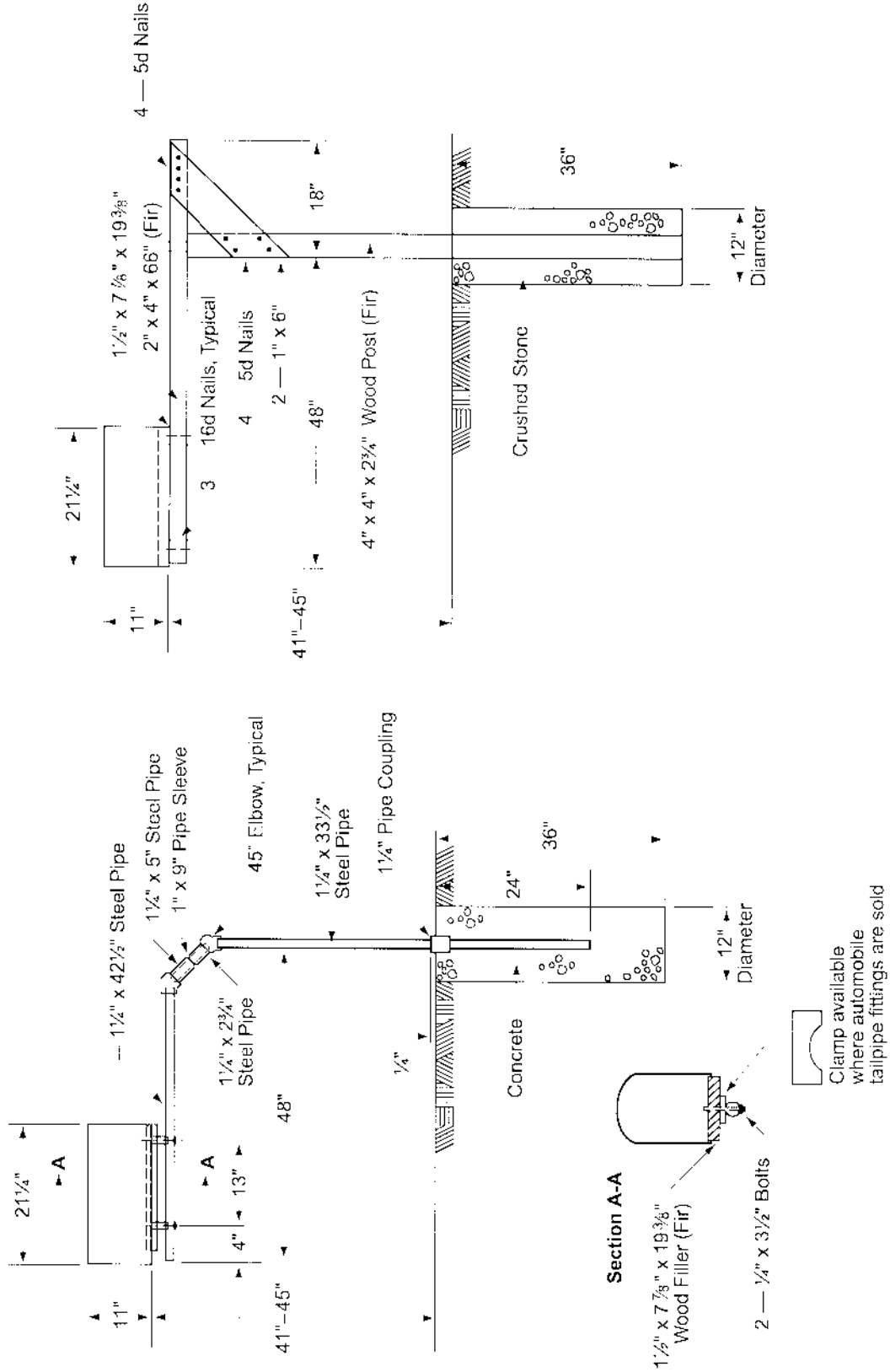
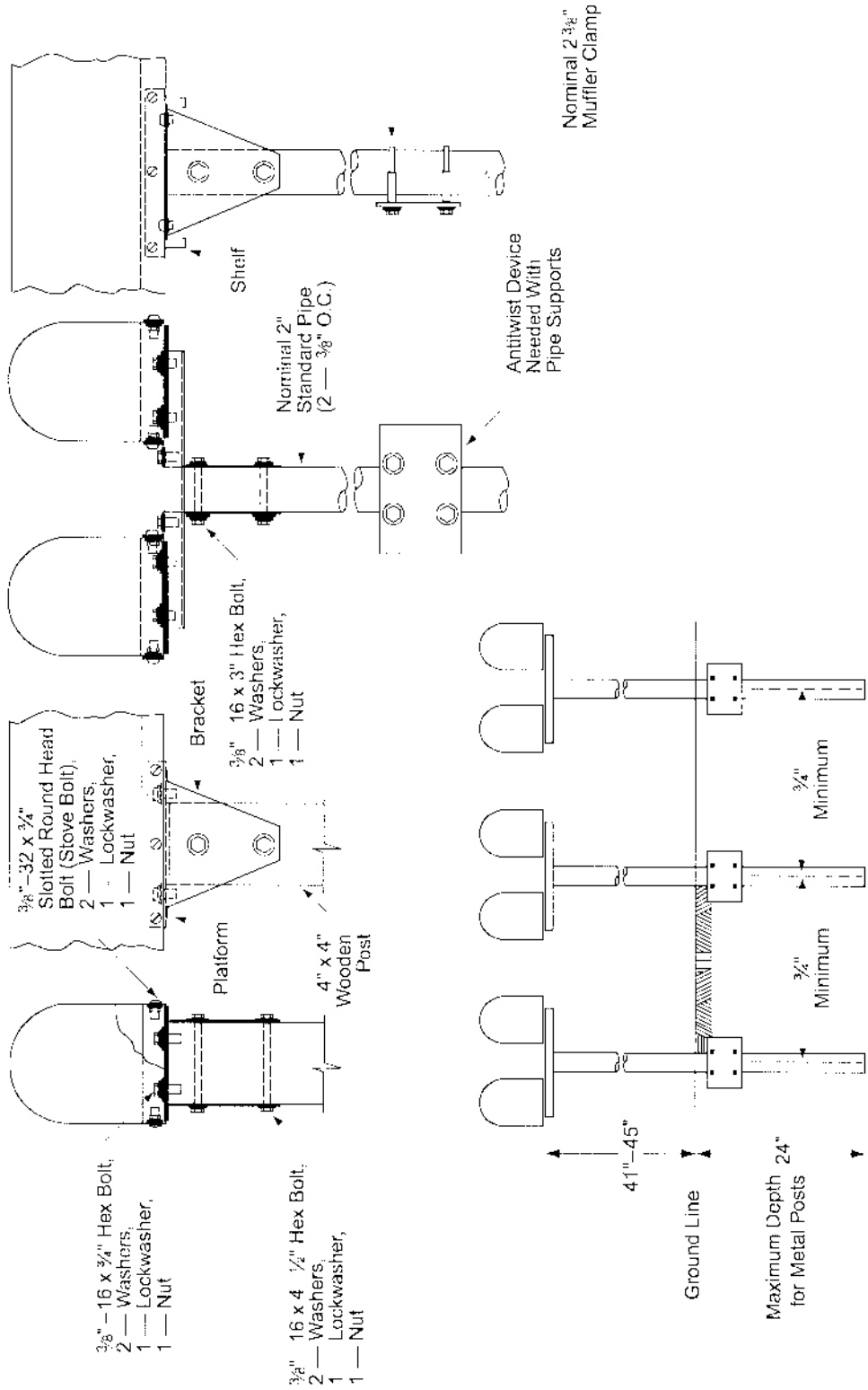

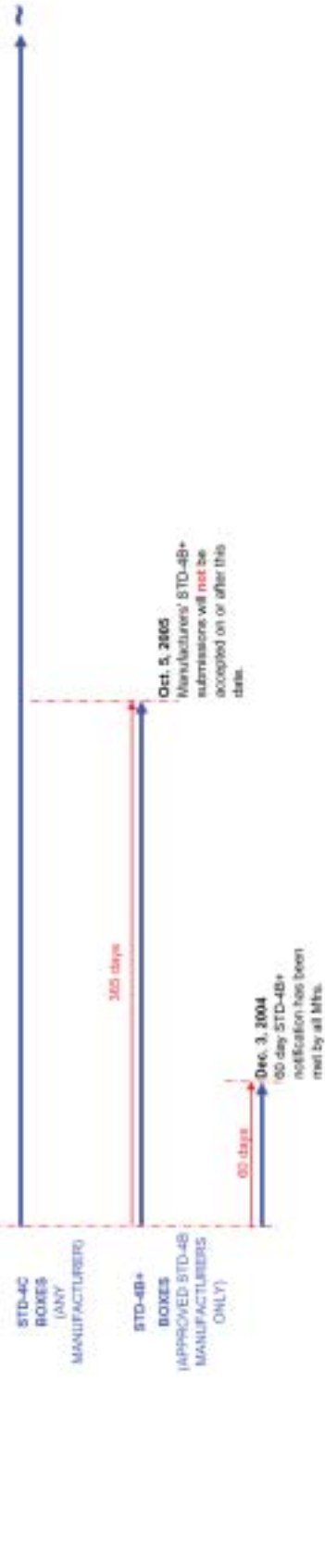

DMM AND IMM REVISIONS

Admission of Flies of the Family Drosophilidae

Effective May 12, 2005, *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM)* 601.9.3.9 and *International Mail Manual (IMM)* 139.1 are revised to reflect the admission of flies of the family Drosophilidae. With this admission, the only live animals that are mailable in the international mailstream are bees, leeches, silkworms, and flies of the family Drosophilidae. More varieties of live animals are allowed in the domestic mailstream.

None of the flies in the family Drosophilidae have any harmful effect on the environment. None attack growing produce in the manner of flies such as the "Med fly." Flies from this family are not recognized as vectors for human or animal diseases. They do not bite or sting. Nothing about these flies poses a hazard to Postal Service™ workers or the public.

The flies of the family Drosophilidae are widely used in biomedical research. Hundreds of research laboratories in more than 40 countries use these organisms for important scientific studies, and the sharing of fly strains between laboratories is absolutely essential to research progress.

The exchange of flies of the family Drosophilidae is limited to institutions and organizations capable of obtaining the necessary pre-authorization to mail live animals in the domestic mailstream from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

We will incorporate these revisions into the next printed version of the DMM and into IMM 31, and also into the online versions of the DMM and IMM, both of which are accessible via Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.gov>.

DMM REVISION

Minimum Load Standards for Mail Prepared on Pallets

The Postal Service™ is finding ways to make it easier for customers to enter mail. One way is by providing mailers with alternatives when preparing mail on pallets. Moving more mail on pallets, rather than in sacks, also will help increase efficiency and reduce costs.

Effective June 1, 2005, Mailing Standards of the *United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* 705.8.0 is revised to allow lower minimum loads for specified pallets. Mailers may begin preparing mail according to the revised standards immediately.

We will incorporate these revisions into the next printed version of the DMM and into the monthly update of the online DMM available via Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.com>.

8.5.3 Minimum Load

[Revise 8.5.3a to read as follows:]

The following minimum load standards apply to mail prepared on pallets:

- a. For Periodicals, Standard Mail, and Package Services (except for Parcel Post mailed at BMC Presort, OBMC Presort, DSCF, and DDU rates):
 - 1. In a single mailing, the minimum load per pallet is 250 pounds of bundles, parcels, or sacks, except as provided in items 2 through 4 below. When preparing letter trays on pallets, the minimum load is 36 linear feet or three layers of letter trays.
 - 2. There is no minimum load for pallets entered at a destination delivery unit (DDU) if the mail on those pallets is for that unit's service area.
 - 3. A pallet may contain a minimum of 100 pounds of nonletter-size mail in bundles on any pallet that is:
 - a) A BMC/ASF pallet entered at the destination BMC or ASF;
 - b) An ADC pallet entered at the destination ADC;
 - c) An SCF pallet entered at the destination SCF;
 - d) The only pallet entered at an individual destination BMC/ASF, ADC, or SCF facility.
 - 4. At an SCF, a 5-digit, 3-digit, or SCF pallet may contain less than the required minimum load of mail for that SCF's service area only if the SCF manager provides written authorization for such preparation.

There are five mail processing categories for mailpieces: letter, flat, machinable parcel, irregular parcel, and outside parcel. We assign each mailpiece to one of these categories based on the physical dimensions and characteristics of the mailpiece, regardless of the placement or orientation of the delivery address on the piece. You will find the physical standards for processing categories in 101 for retail (single-piece rate) mail, 201 for discount letters, 301 for discount flats, and 401 for discount parcels. [C050.1.0]

NOTICE

Sharps Medical Waste Container No Longer Accepted

Effective immediately, Mailing Standards has revoked Stericycle, Inc., authorization for sharps medical waste container USPS-050-A (2-2G-V2). Mailing Standards has also revoked authorization for SCS Corporation's identical sharps medical waste container USPS-052-A (2-2G-V2), and GRP & Associates, Inc.'s, medical waste container USPS-058J (GRP 2-2G).

Postal Service™ employees must not accept containers bearing the model numbers listed above. If containers are identified already in the mailstream, set them aside and contact the addressee to pick them up. If customers ask why we are refusing to accept the container, tell them it is no longer considered mailable and they should contact the appropriate manufacturer.

Authorization for this particular container was revoked because testing revealed that the container did not satisfy all required packaging standards.

This notice applies only to the model numbers identified above. Stericycle, SCS, and GRP manufacture and distribute other authorized sharps medical waste containers. These containers should continue to be accepted for mailing by the Postal Service.

The one-on-one interview provides the last opportunity to resolve any questions regarding eligibility and suitability and to gauge the degree of fit between the applicant and the job. This determination should weigh such factors as work setting and job content, and performance dimensions such as communications skills, cooperation, adaptability, and dependability. The interviewer recommends or does not recommend the applicant for employment to the selecting official.

541 Training and Preparation of Interviewers

Prior to the interview, the interviewer who must be an EAS employee or an authorized contractor should thoroughly review the preemployment investigation file containing all the information collected from and about the applicant, including the interview checklist (see Exhibit 541, Interview Sheet and Checklist, Pages 1, 2, and 3). New interviewers must successfully complete the Interviewer Training course 21585-00 using the restricted Interview Guide and the restricted Interviewer's Toolkit. Interviewers must be familiar with the interview process and general interviewing techniques, strategies, and applicable regulatory issues. Interviewers must prepare for each interview by (1) familiarizing themselves with the information that is known about the applicant, and (2) determining what questions to ask the applicant or what information to seek to determine the applicant's viability.

Competitive Service and Excepted Service Organizations

Individuals employed by executive branch organizations designated as **competitive service organizations may be eligible for noncompetitive transfer** into the Postal Service, provided they were hired competitively into a career or career-conditional position and are currently serving satisfactorily in such a position. Individuals employed by executive branch organizations designated as **excepted service organizations** by Executive Order, by the Office of Personnel Management, and by statute **are not eligible for noncompetitive transfer to the Postal Service.**

An applicant may *not* be eligible for transfer even though he or she *is* employed by an agency listed under competitive service organizations below. HANDBOOK F-1 REVISION

New Account Identifier Code for SPORT Offices

Effective May 20, 2005, Small Post Office Reporting Tool (SPORT) Post Offices™ and retail units using the Mobile Data Collection Device (MDCD) scanner to report their daily financial report will follow a new process to report stamp stock accountability overages.

Offices will continue to report overage amounts into account identifier code (AIC) 057, Employee Stamp Credit Overage, and will offset the amount to the new AIC 650, Stock Examination Overage, and the scanner will compute the new AIC 843, Stock Adjustment Overage. The use of AIC 650 and AIC 843 will increase stamp accountability as a result of an overage in a stamp stock examination.

First, make the following entries on the manual PS Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report*:

- In the Receipts column, record the amount in AIC 057.
- In the Disbursements section, write in the AIC 650 and the amount.
- In the Stamp Accountability section, write in the AIC 843 and the amount (+).

Second, using your MDCD scanner, make the following entries in the SAFR AIC Activities menu, option 1: MISC AICS:

- AIC 057 and amount.
- AIC 650 and amount.

Do not make an entry into AIC 843. The MDCD scanner is programmed to automatically adjust AIC 843, which will increase stamp accountability. This amount will show up on the SAFR Actability Summary screen.

Note: Offices will no longer use AIC 090, Postage Stock Sales, to offset an overage in a stamp stock examination.

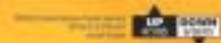

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM C024.2.0 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

42"	72" length and girth combined
over 42" to 44"	24" girth
over 44" to 46"	20" girth
over 46" to 48"	16" girth
	Maximum length 48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.



Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- July 27: National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day.
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.

Note 1: When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until 12 noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

POW-MIA Flag

How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.



When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.

Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

Managing Software Technology Solutions — Software Approval Process and Information Technology Kit

This article establishes the software approval (SA) process and the Information Technology Kit (ITK) as components of the approach the Postal Service™ uses to manage its information technology software solutions, software development tools, commercial off-the-shelf products (COTS), and other software used in the Information Technology infrastructure. *Technology solutions* include those components, technical standards, products, and guidelines that are invoked in the design, creation, and delivery of information technology (IT) solutions for the corporation. They are not in themselves a complete system solution.

Policy

It is the intent of the Postal Service to provide a corporate-level view when selecting technologies used in applications that support business solutions. To do this, during application design, technology will be selected from the software solutions listed in the ITK *Approved*-class category. If a technology is in the ITK *Restricted*-class category, the SA process will be used to determine the technology's use. In addition, the SA process will be used to add new technology solutions to the ITK.

Scope

The software approval process applies to the following:

- All Postal Service functional organizations, employees, suppliers, business partners, and contractors.
- All internal information technology solutions within the corporate technology infrastructure.
- All electronic data sources that interact with the internal Postal Service technology infrastructure.

About the SA Process

The SA process is the step-by-step discipline used to identify new or existing information technology solutions or to modify existing corporate technology solutions. It provides a framework so that technology solutions developed and implemented for *one* functional organization's needs will consider the overarching needs of the corporation and the impact of delivering such solutions on the corporate IT infrastructure. (See Exhibit A, Solution Approval Process as Part of the ISM Process, and Exhibit B, Solution Approval Process.)

For software solutions that require version-number control, a request to change the version number of an existing *Approved*- or *Restricted*-class technology solution must follow the SA process. Different levels of version control for different technology solutions are implemented within the ITK (see <http://itk> for details).

When the SA Process Starts

The SA process starts in Phase 3 of the Integrated Solution Methodology (see <http://ism>). By then, a functional organization's representative will have begun working with an IT portfolio manager (PM/IT) and other IT organizations to develop business solutions. The PM/IT initiates the SA process and accesses the ITK (<http://itk>) to see whether existing technology solutions in the *Approved* or *Restricted* class meet the technical requirements established in ISM Phase 2, Planning.

If . . .	Then . . .
The ITK contains an <i>Approved</i> -class technology solution that meets requirements,	System development activities continue.
The ITK contains a <i>Restricted</i> -class technology solution,	The SA process guides you through the steps needed to request permission and gain approval to use the solution.
If the ITK does not contain a technology solution,	The SA process guides you through the steps needed to establish an acceptable solution.

The SA process does not review code or track completed software development projects deployed within the corporation.

Benefits

For functional organizations:

- Reduced costs in the areas of purchasing technology solutions (when approved solutions are selected), support for the application over its lifecycle, and integration of the solution into the corporate infrastructure.

- Step-by-step help and direction to identify, select, and implement standardized and IT-supported technology solutions.
- More rapid deployment of information technology solutions by leveraging the existing infrastructure.

For the Postal Service:

- Less fragmentation within the corporate information technology business solution environment.
- Reduced costs in the areas of training, maintenance, and operational support.
- The ability to leverage internal expertise.

About the ITK

The ITK provides the list of Postal Service technology solutions. These solutions are classified as *Approved*, *Restricted*, and *Obsolete/Rejected* (see definitions, below). The ITK focuses on standards and software solutions and includes data about technology solutions, such as the responsible IT service manager, details of the functionality, and applicability of the technology solutions. The ITK, formerly known as the Integrated Tool Kit, is used to invoke the SA process and is available at <http://ITK>.

Definitions of Classifications Used in the ITK

Approved Technology Solutions. Standards, products, or tools that are a strategic part of the technical infrastructure. Items that have enterprise deployment, provide a full range of services in their category, have a known and articulated purchasing strategy in place, and considered to be authorized without further approval.

Restricted. Standards, products, or tools that are isolated in the infrastructure. Items that are used to meet specific business needs, but for which general widespread deployment is not authorized; typically represent “one-of-a-kind” solutions that are approved to meet narrow or relatively short-term needs; or that require an SA request to obtain permission to use.

Obsolete/Rejected. Technology solutions that the Enterprise Architecture Committee (EAC) has evaluated and rejected or made obsolete. (This category is used by IT for tracking and analysis purposes and is not available for public review.)

Access to and Use of the ITK

Who can access	Type of access	Use

Information Technology Responsibilities

The vice president, *Chief Technology Officer*, who is responsible for providing the direction and requirements for establishing the Postal Service IT infrastructure and methods and tools for application development, has the following responsibilities:

1. Manages the introduction of all business solutions to the IT infrastructure, including hardware and platform technology management.
2. Resolves technology solution disputes as presented by the Enterprise Architecture Committee (EAC).
3. Serves as final approval authority for the addition of new technology solutions to the ITK.

The manager, *Technology Support*, who also serves as the chair of the EAC, will do the following:

1. Execute delegated authority on behalf of Supply Management, Purchasing.
2. Assist in negotiating contractual fulfillment for SA-approved solutions.

Portfolio managers, as the interface between functional organizations and IT service managers, will evaluate, clarify, and present functional organization business requirements to the appropriate IT service managers.

Integrated Business Solutions Services Center managers will do the following:

1. Use the functional business organization requirements document created by the PM/IT to confer with IT service managers to identify technical requirements.
2. Present selected technology solutions from the ITK to the IT service manager.

IT service managers will do the following:

1. Review requests to use *Restricted*-class technology solutions within their respective service domains.
2. Assess requests for applicability.

3. Notify the EAC of decisions affecting pending requests.
4. Formulate alternative solutions when required or desirable.
5. Submit requests for new technology solutions to the EAC within their respective service domains.
6. Approve the use of *Restricted*-class technology solutions within their respective service domains.

Functional Organization Responsibilities

Functional organization vice presidents and executive sponsors of information technology solutions are responsible for the following:

1. Ensuring that their respective organizations work with their assigned PM/IT when considering technological solutions for the IT infrastructure.
2. Following the SA process.
3. Using the ITK.

Exhibit A. Solution Approval Process as Part of the ISM Process

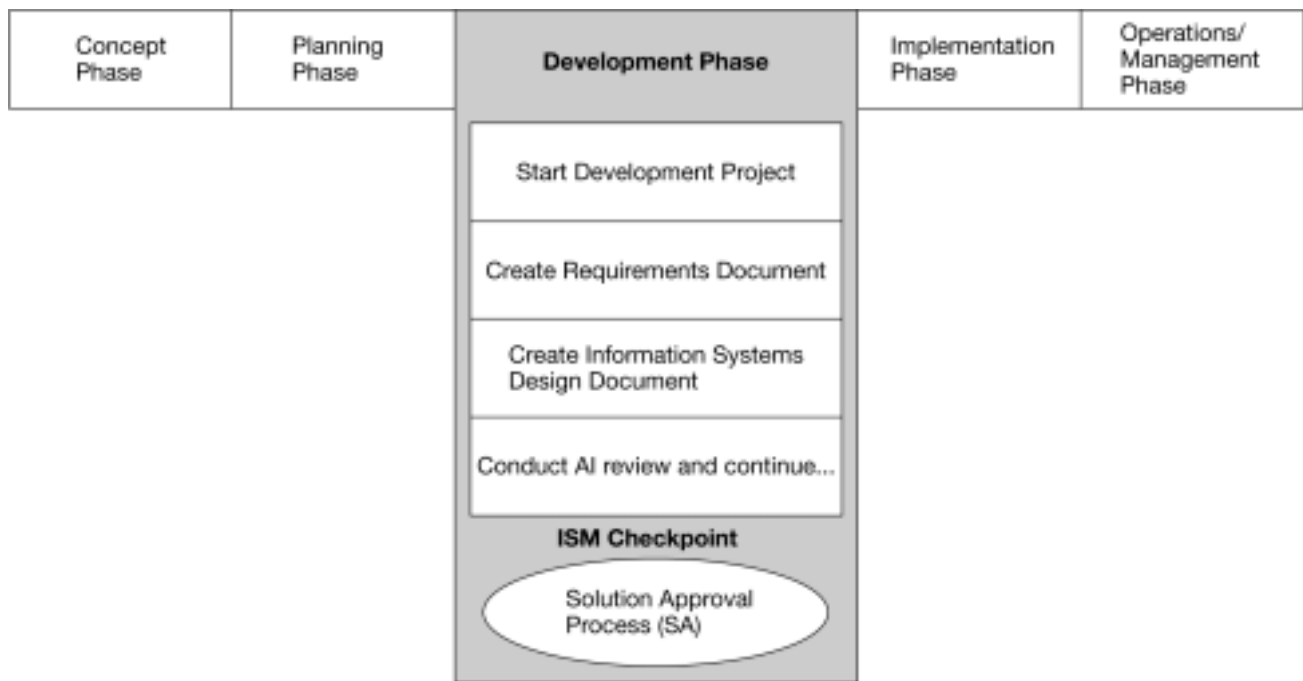
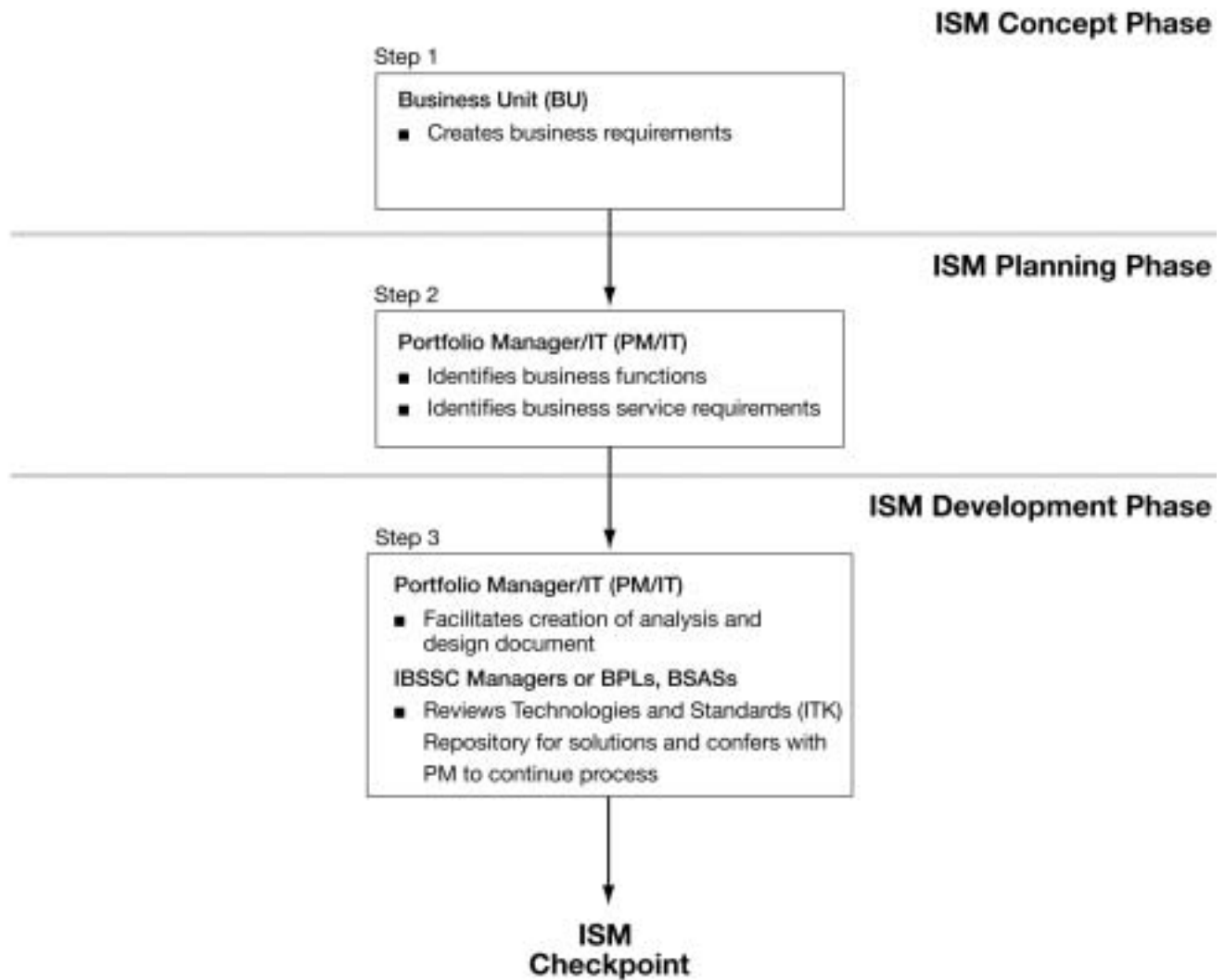
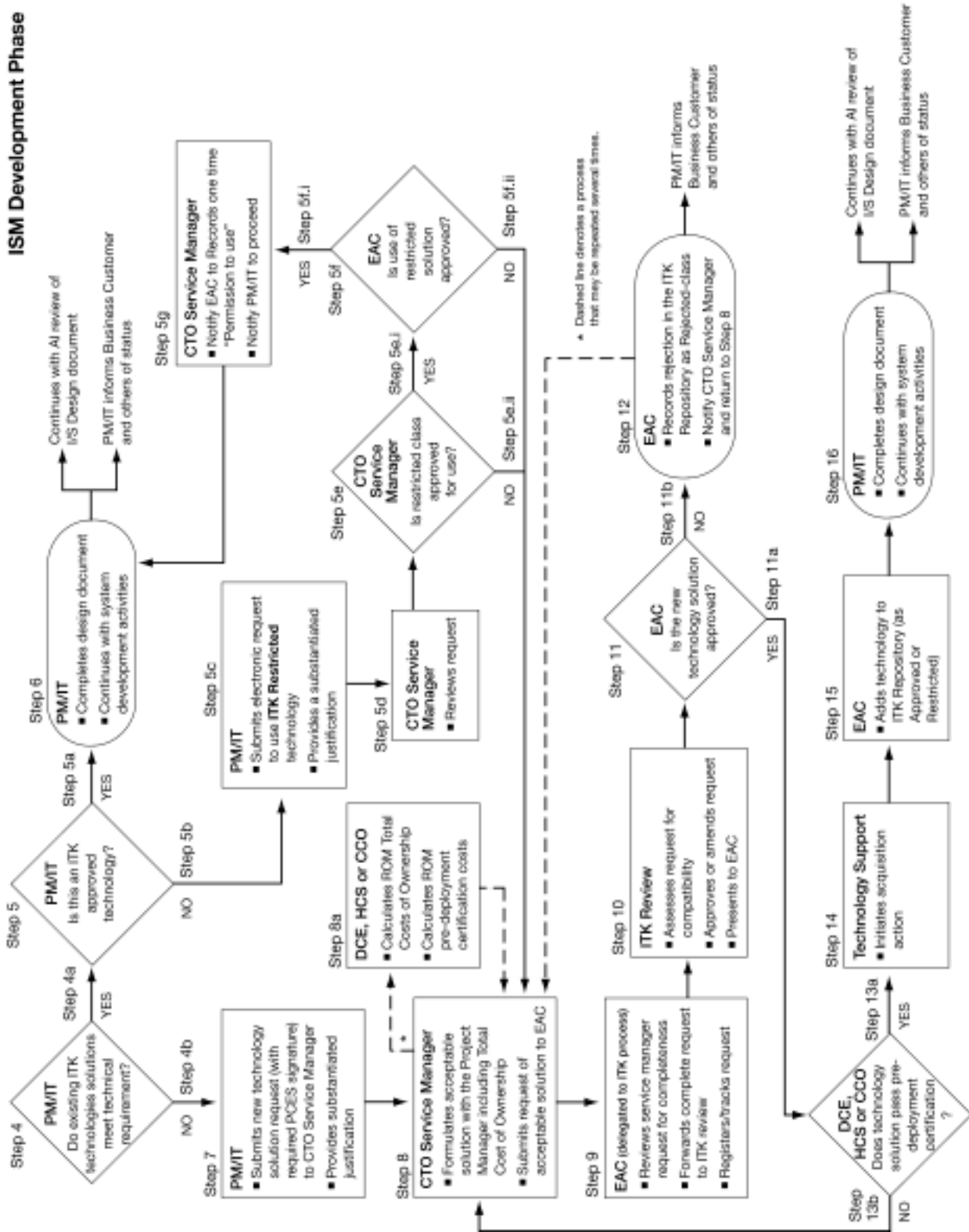


Exhibit B. Solution Approval Process

Our international facilities are experiencing difficulties scanning the barcode printed on the new customs declaration PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note* — CP 72, when the form is placed incorrectly inside PS Form 2976-E, *Customs Declaration Envelope* — CP 91 (clear plastic envelope).

Consequently, all PS Forms 2976-E with an edition date prior to January 2004 must be discarded/recycled. Only the January 2004 edition of this form may be used because it is large enough to hold the most recent edition (January 2004) of PS Form 2976-A.

To prevent against delays in delivery, customers and mail acceptance personnel must ensure the following:

- PS Form 2976-A is not folded when inserted into PS Form 2976-E.
- The barcode on PS Form 2976-A is completely visible through PS Form 2976-E.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

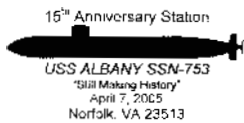
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

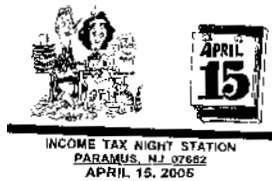

New Conduct on Postal Service Property Course

Determining what conduct is allowed on Postal Service™ property can be difficult, especially when the situation calls for a quick response. Fortunately, a new course explains the rules in simple, clear terms.

What is the new course? The General Counsel's office, with assistance from Headquarters Employee Resource Management, has converted its Conduct on Postal Property Quiz into a new Web-based course now available at USPS eLearning Blue at <http://hrishq.usps.gov/lms>, under "Communicating Policy/Program Information." The course is called "Conduct on Postal Property," and the Course ID number is 25201-06. Since it has been approved for mandatory training for fiscal year 05, the Law Department recommends that managers direct all employees who deal with conduct issues to take the course.

Who should take this course? All postmasters, station managers, customer relations representatives, and other employees who deal with requests from members of the public to engage in non-postal activities on real property owned or controlled by the Postal Service should take the course.

What will the course do for you? The course will lead you through a series of scenarios and situations that are similar to those you encounter during the course of your business and ask whether or not the activity described is prohibited. Plus, you will get training credit for taking the course.

Where are the Conduct on Postal Property regulations located? The regulations are located in three places: *Postal Operations Manual (POM) 124*; *Poster 7, Rules and*

Regulations Governing Conduct on Postal Property; and *39 CFR 232.1*. A review of either *Poster 7* or *POM 124* would be useful before you take the course. You can also check out the General Counsel's Web site at <http://blue.usps.gov/uspslaw/>, under *Conduct on Postal Property*.

What activities are covered by the regulations? Some of the activities the regulations prohibit on Postal Service property and that are covered in the course are:

- Campaigning for election to any public office.
- Soliciting signatures on petitions, polls, or surveys.
- Soliciting contributions for charity.
- Distributing leaflets, picketing, demonstrating, and other similar conduct in Postal Service lobbies.
- Vending, commercial advertising, depositing literature, and setting up tables and other structures.

Will there be tools available after taking the course? Yes. First, you will be able to download and print the regulations for distribution to members of the public. Also, after you take the course, you will be able to re-enter it for up to a year and use it as a resource tool by clicking on the *Find Your Issue* link to find answers to questions that may come up later. The course explains Postal Service policy in clear, simple terms and provides answers to commonly asked questions. Finally, if you have a question that is not covered in the quiz, you can use the link provided to contact your field legal office to get an answer.

Postal Service™ facilities requiring cleaning service contracts with self-employed individuals that exceed the \$10,000 annual threshold or firms that exceed the \$2,500 annual threshold should see the listing below to determine who to contact to requisition services within their state. If the district crosses a state line, the requisition should follow the state where the district office is located. Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico districts will continue to handle their own requirements.

The San Francisco Purchasing Service Center, 390 Main Street, Suite 602, San Francisco, CA 94105-5016 will procure janitorial services for the following states: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, Wisconsin, and Wyoming. The contract administrator is Richard Galvan and his telephone number is 415-536-6558.

The Environmental and MRO Category Management Center, Post Office Box 667190, Dallas, TX 75266-7190 will procure janitorial services for the following states:


