But this time, it was a USPS employee who received a life-saving marrow donation.

In 1986, Richard Tate, a 21-year Postal Service employee from Wilmington, DE, was diagnosed with chronic myelogenous leukemia. He was placed on the marrow transplant list. Doctors said Tate had two to three years to live.

But Tate endured until 1997, when a donor was found. "If it weren't for this transplant, I would not have been able to enjoy my four grandsons," Tate said.

## Energy efficient lighting leads to Seattle savings

It pays to be green. Seattle City Light, the city's municipal electric company, recently presented a check for \$443,000 to the Seattle District, a rebate for installing new lighting at the Seattle Processing and Distribution Center.

The new lighting uses significantly less energy, provides better illumination and uses longer-lasting bulbs - not to mention brighter working conditions for Postal Service employees. The annual savings from the new lights for the

600,000-square-foot building are projected at $\$ 180,000$ a year.

More than money was saved. The new lights conserve more than 3 million kilowatt hours a year, easing Seattle's energy demand. The electricity saved is enough to power 338 homes in Seattle for a year.

One more plus - the glass and the metal from the old light fixtures have been recycled.

## Domestic Mail Manual Revision: Using Intelligent Mail Barcodes on Flat-Size Mailpieces

Effective May 1, 2007, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ encourages mailers to use Intelligent Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ barcodes by allowing their use on automation-rate First-Class Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$, Periodicals, Standard Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$, and Bound Printed Matter flat-size mailpieces for rate eligibility in lieu of POSTNET ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ barcodes. We also will allow First-Class Mail, Periodicals, Standard Mail, and Bound Printed Matter flats with Intelligent Mail barcodes to participate in Confirm ${ }^{\circledR}$ service, and FirstClass Mail and Periodicals flats with Intelligent Mail barcodes to participate in OneCode ACS ${ }^{\text {M }}$. We will revise parts 302, 333, 343, 363, 503, 507, 707, and
of the Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual $\left(\mathrm{DMM}^{\circledR}\right)$ to incorporate these changes in our next update of the DMM.

Automation-rate flats are required to have a valid ZIP $+4^{\circledR}$ or delivery point barcode. As of March 1, 2007, mailers have been able to use either type of barcode - an Intelligent Mail barcode or a delivery point barcode - on automation-rate letters. Allowing mailers to use Intelligent Mail barcodes on automation-rate flats encourages greater use of this information-rich barcode.

When mailers choose to use the Intelligent Mail barcode on flats, they must include coding for an optional endorsement line and an assigned numeric Business Entity

Identifier (BEI). To obtain a BEI, OneCode ACS subscribers should contact the ACS department at the National Customer Support Center at 800-331-5746. Confirm subscribers approved for OneCode Confirm ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ should incorporate their Confirm Subscriber ID (which is their BEI) when using Intelligent Mail barcodes. OneCode Confirm subscribers can contact Confirm Customer Assistance at 800-2383150 or refer to Publication 197, Confirm Service Featuring OneCode Confirm, for specific instructions. Mailers printing the Intelligent Mail barcode solely for automation rate eligibility should contact the PostalOne! ${ }^{\circledR}$ Help Desk at 800-522-9085 to obtain a BEI. Complete specifications for Intelligent Mail barcodes are defined in the USPS ${ }^{\circledR}$ publication: USPS-B-3200, which is available for download at http://ribbs.usps.gov/OneCodeSOLUTION/.

### 4.0 Barcode Placement

[Revise 4.1 and 4.2 to allow Intelligent Mail barcodes as follows:]

### 4.1 General Barcode Placement for Flats

On any flat-size piece claimed at automation rates, the piece may bear one POSTNET barcode or Intelligent Mail barcode under 4.2 or it may bear two POSTNET barcodes under 4.3. Other mailer-applied non-USPS barcodes may appear on the address side of the piece if the barcode format is not detectable or confusing to automated postal equipment.

### 4.2 Applying One Barcode

On any flat-size mailpiece claimed at an automation rate, the barcode may be anywhere on the address side as long as it is at least $1 / 8$ inch from any edge of the piece. The portion of the surface of the piece on which the barcode is printed must meet the barcode dimensions and spacing requirements in 708.4.2.5, and the reflectance standards in 709.4.4. Intelligent Mail barcodes are subject to standards in 708.4.3.2. Address block barcodes are subject to the standards in 708.4.6a. through 708.4.6e.

All pieces in a First-Class Mail automation rate mailing must:
[Revise item e by adding the option of an Intelligent Mail barcode as follows:]
e. Bear an accurate barcode meeting the standards in 708.4.0, a ZIP+4 barcode, a delivery point barcode (DPBC), or an Intelligent Mail barcode with a ZIP+4 or delivery point routing code, either on the piece or on an insert showing through a barcode window.

[Revise item e by adding the option of an Intelligent Mail barcode as follows:]
e. Bear an accurate ZIP+4 or delivery point barcode, or Intelligent Mail barcode with a ZIP+4 or delivery point routing code, meeting the standards in 302.4.0, Barcode Placement and 708.4.0, Barcoding Standards for Letters and Flats, either on the piece or on an insert showing through a window.

### 5.0 Additional Eligibility Standards for Barcoded Bound Printed Matter Flats

### 5.1 Basic Eligibility Standards for Barcoded Bound Printed Matter

[Revise 5.1 by adding a new second sentence to allow Intelligent Mail barcodes as follows:]
The barcode discount applies only to BPM flat-size pieces that bear a correct, readable ZIP+4 or delivery point barcode (DPBC) under 708.4.0, Barcoding Standards for Letters and Flats, for the ZIP +4 code or numeric DPBC of the delivery address. Instead of ZIP+4 Codes or DPBCs, pieces may bear Intelligent Mail barcodes (under 708.4.0) containing a ZIP+4 or delivery point routing code for the delivery address. ${ }^{* *}$

### 13.3 Barcodes

### 13.3.1 General Barcode Requirement

[Revise the introductory text of 13.3.1 to allow Intelligent Mail barcodes on flats as follows:]

At the time of mailing, each piece in a mailing that is intended to generate Confirm service information must bear a customer-applied PLANET Code barcode under 13.3.4 or an Intelligent Mail barcode under 13.3.2. Instead of a PLANET Code barcode, mailers may apply an Intelligent Mail barcode, under 708.4.0, on letters or flats. Mailers must apply barcodes that meet the applicable specifications in 708.4.0 and the following standards:
a. Origin Confirm pieces must bear:
[Revise item a3 by adding the option of using an Intelligent Mail barcode as follows:]
3. For other flat-size reply mail, the piece must bear both a PLANET Code barcode and a POSTNET barcode that correctly corresponds to the delivery address. Mailers may use an Intelligent Mail barcode under 13.3.2 and 708.4.0 instead of using a PLANET Code barcode and POSTNET barcode.
[Revise item b to allow an Intelligent Mail barcode on all destination Confirm pieces as follows:]
b. Destination Confirm pieces must bear either an Intelligent Mail barcode or a PLANET Code barcode. If required by the rate claimed at the time of mailing, Intelligent Mail barcodes must correctly correspond to the delivery address. Mailers not using an Intelligent Mail barcode for Destination Confirm must use PLANET Code and POSTNET barcodes under these conditions:

### 13.3.2 Intelligent Mail Barcodes

[Revise 13.3.2 to allow Intelligent Mail barcodes on flats as follows:]
Customers participating in OneCode Confirm may apply Intelligent Mail barcodes on letter-size pieces or on flat-size pieces meeting automation-compatibility standards in 201.3 .0 (letters) or 301.3 .0 (flats). Do not apply a PLANET Code barcode to any mailpiece with an Intelligent Mail barcode. Only one Intelligent Mail barcode may appear on each piece, according to the standards below.
a. Intelligent Mail barcodes meeting all applicable standards may be used in lieu of POSTNET barcodes. When using an Intelligent Mail barcode on letter-size pieces for rate eligibility and OneCode Confirm, place the barcode in any position permitted in 202.5.0.
b. When using an Intelligent Mail barcode on letter-size pieces only for OneCode Confirm, place the barcode according to 202.5.0 or directly above the address block with the top of each bar less than 4 inches from the bottom of the mailpiece.
c. When using an Intelligent Mail barcode on flat-size pieces, place the barcode according to 302.4.0.
d. Mailers must generate Intelligent Mail barcodes by the same method used to receive USPS barcode certification during the application process in 13.2.3.
e. Intelligent Mail barcodes must meet the barcode and format standards in 708.4.0 and in Specification USPS-B-3200, at http://ribbs.usps.gov/OneCode SOLUTION/.

### 3.0 Address Correction Services

3.2 Address Change Service (ACS)
[Revise title and text of 3.2.6 to allow Intelligent Mail barcodes on flats and on Periodicals letters as follows:]

### 3.2.6 Additional Standards - When Using Intelligent Mail Barcodes

Mailers can access OneCode ACS using Intelligent Mail barcodes, which are capable of encoding a valid Service Type Identifier indicating the ancillary service requested, a numeric Business Entity Identifier (the equivalent of a participant code), and a unique numeric mailpiece identifier (keyline). This option is available for First-Class Mail and Periodicals letters and flat-size mailpieces only. "Address Service Requested" ancillary service is available on FirstClass Mail and Periodicals flats and letters when using the Intelligent Mail barcode. Periodicals not requesting Address Service Requested will receive their current option of address correction notifications. The Service Type Identifier will indicate the ancillary service requested. Service Type Identifiers to request "Change Service Requested" ancillary service are available for First-Class Mail flats only. Printed endorsements must not be used to request these ancillary services in conjunction with an Intelligent Mail barcode. Mailpieces must meet the following specifications:
a. Letter-size mailpieces must be automationcompatible. The Intelligent Mail barcode must appear at the top of or above the address block and must contain the correct delivery point routing code that corresponds to the delivery address.
b. Flat-size mailpieces may be mailed at nonautomation or automation rates.
c. If using a window envelope, maintain a clearance between the leftmost and rightmost bars and any printing or window edge of at least $1 / 8$ inch, and maintain a clearance between the Intelligent Mail barcode and the top and bottom window edges of at least $1 / 25$ inch. These clearances must be maintained during the insert's range of movement in the envelope.
d. The Intelligent Mail barcode must contain an 11-digit delivery point code.
e. The Intelligent Mail barcode must meet the technical specifications as described in 708.4.2 and USPS publication, Specification USPS-B-3200.

### 14.0 Automation Rate Eligibility

### 14.1 Basic Standards

### 14.1.1 General

All pieces in a Periodicals automation rate mailing must:
d. Bear an accurate barcode matching the delivery address and meeting the standards in 708.4.0, under these conditions:
[Revise item $d 2$ by adding the option of an Intelligent Mail barcode as follows:]
2. If a flat: the mailer may use a ZIP+4 barcode, a DPBC, or an Intelligent Mail barcode with a ZIP+4 or delivery point routing code, under 708.4.0. Mailers may apply the barcode either on the piece or on an insert showing through a window.

## Technical Specifications

### 4.0 Barcoding Standards for Letters and Flats

### 4.3 Intelligent Mail Barcodes

### 4.3.1 Definition

[Revise 4.3.1 by adding flats for rate eligibility, with the inclusion of optional endorsement line information, as follows:]
An Intelligent Mail barcode is the USPS-developed barcode that mailers use to encode routing and tracking information on mail that can be read by automated mail processing equipment to sort mail and to provide tracking information to the mailers. An Intelligent Mail barcode consists of 65 vertical bars, each representing one of four possible states: full bar, ascender, tracker, and descender. These 65 bars encode a string of 31 digits, divided into two parts: a 20-digit tracking code and an 11-digit routing code (when required). The 11-digit routing code may contain a ZIP Code, a ZIP+4 Code, or a delivery point code, unless required to contain a certain level of code in specific applications; no correction digit is needed within an Intelligent Mail barcode. Mailers may use Intelligent Mail barcodes as follows:
a. When used on letters for automation-rate eligibility purposes, the routing code must contain a delivery point code that accurately matches the delivery address.
b. When used on flat-size pieces for automation-rate eligibility purposes, the barcode must contain either a ZIP+4 or a delivery point routing code that accurately matches the delivery address. When flat-size pieces bear an Intelligent Mail barcode for automation rate eligibility, the barcode on a piece that contains an optional endorsement line (OEL) must contain OEL coding that includes information in exhibit 708.7.1.1 corresponding to the correct sortation level of each bundle. The OEL information in the Intelligent Mail barcode is required in addition to a physical OEL. See the Intelligent Mail Barcode Resource Guide available at http://ribbs.usps.gov/ OneCodeSOLUTION for more information on incorporating OELs in Intelligent Mail barcodes.
c. Mailers must incorporate the Business Entity Identifier (BEI) code in the Customer Identifier field. To obtain a BEI, OneCode ACS subscribers can contact the ACS department at the National Customer Support Center at 1-800-331-5746. Confirm subscribers approved for OneCode Confirm must incorporate their Confirm Subscriber ID (which is their BEI) when using Intelligent Mail barcodes. OneCode Confirm subscribers can contact Confirm Customer Assistance at 1-800-238-3150 or refer to Publication 197 for specific instructions. Mailers printing the Intelligent Mail barcode solely for automation rate eligibility
can contact the PostalOne! Help Desk at 1-800-522-9085 to obtain a BEI.

### 7.0 Optional Endorsement Lines (OELs)

### 7.1 OEL Use

### 7.1.1 Basic Standards

[Revise 7.1.1 to require an imbedded OEL on flats when an Intelligent Mail barcode is used for automation rate eligibility as follows:]

An optional endorsement line (OEL) may be used to label bundles instead of applying pressure-sensitive bundle labels or facing slips to the top piece of bundles. The OEL must show carrier route information or the type of bundle and ZIP Code information as shown in Exhibit 7.1.1, OEL Formats. Use of OELs on bundles is subject to the standards for the rate claimed. At the mailer's option, pieces in trays of noncarrier route automation letter-size mail may bear OEL information that corresponds to the sortation level of the tray in which the pieces are placed. The ZIP Code for use on OELs must include the 3-digit ZIP Code prefix or 5-digit ZIP Code as required. OELs are required under the following conditions:
a. OELs are required with 5 -digit scheme and 3-digit scheme bundles.
b. When flat-size pieces bear an Intelligent Mail barcode (under 708.4.3) for automation-rate eligibility purposes, the barcode on a piece that contains an optional endorsement line (OEL) must contain OEL coding that includes information in exhibit 708.7.1.1 corresponding to the correct sortation level of each bundle. The OEL information in the Intelligent Mail barcode is required in addition to a physical OEL. See the Intelligent Mail Barcode Resource Guide available at http:// ribbs.usps.gov/OneCodeSOLUTION for more information on incorporating OELs in Intelligent Mail barcodes.

## ELM Revision: Allowance for Military Service in Computing Annual Leave Category

Effective March 29, Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) section 512.232, Service of an Employee Eligible for Military Retirement Annuity, is revised to add $512.232 \mathrm{a}(4)$ to reflect the current practice of using the military service years of employees who qualify for military retirement while serving in current career appointments for computing their annual leave category.

Section 512.232c is updated to provide Web site locations for Standard Form (SF) 180, Request Pertaining to Military Records, and SF 813, Verification of a Military Retiree's Service in Nonwartime Campaigns or Expeditions. Exhibits 512.232 b and 512.232 c , which displayed facsimiles of the forms, are deleted.

Exhibit 512.232a, Wars, Campaigns, and Expeditions of the Armed Forces Since 1937, is updated with current information, reformatted for easier use, and renamed Exhibit 512.232.

### 512.232 Service of an Employee Eligible for Military Retirement Annuity

The following military service is used in computing the years of service that determine the annual leave category:
[Revise 512.232a as follows:]
a. Full Credit. Full leave accrual credit for all active military service is granted if a military retiree meets one of the following four conditions:
[Add 512.232a(4) as follows:]
(4) The individual first becomes eligible for a uniformed services annuity while serving as a career employee. This provision applies to members of the Reserve Component of the Armed Forces (Reserves and National Guard) who (a) qualify for
an annuity because of reserve service or (b) are involuntarily recalled to active duty under Title 10, qualify for uniformed services retirement during that period of active duty, and then are restored to federal civilian employment on completion of that period of involuntary military service. This provision applies only to the employee's current period of civilian employment; if the employee separates and is reemployed later, the provision is no longer applicable.
b. Partial Credit. Military retirees who do not qualify for full leave accrual credit can qualify for partial credit based on the following:
(2) Service in a nonwartime campaign or expedition does not entitle the military retiree to credit for the duration of the campaign or expedition but only for the period of service in the campaign or expedition.

c. Verification. Military service should be verified:
[Revise 512.232c(3) and (4) as follows:]
(3) Military Records Center. Addresses and other data necessary to verify service are provided in SF180, Request Pertaining to Military Records, found at the following Web site: http://www.archives.gov/ research/order/standard-form-180.pdf.
(4) Campaign or Expeditionary Service. Verify by sending a completed SF 813, Verification of a Military Retiree's Service in Nonwartime Campaigns or Expeditions, to the appropriate military records center. SF 813 can be found at the following Web site: http:// www.opm.gov/forms/pdf_fill/SF813.pdf.

Effective April 1, 2007, Electronic Money Order Voucher Entry System (eMOVES) and Small Post Office Reporting Tool (SPORT) offices must use revised PS Form 1412, Daily Financial Report, dated March 2007. The March 2007 edition of this form replaces the February 2005 edition. All previous editions of PS Form 1412 are obsolete and must be discarded.

Post Offices ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ and retail postal units with POS ONE or integrated retail terminal (IRT) equipment will continue to use the system-generated form. In the event of power outages or POS ONE or IRT system failures, the office must use PS Form 1412 as part of its contingency plan for manual operations.

## Summary of Changes

The changes to PS Form 1412 are as follows:

- Changed account identifier code (AIC) descriptions.
- Deleted AIC 089.
- Added the following AICs: 007, 011, 012, 097, 231, 299, 650, 699, 843, 844, 849, and 850.

Upon the arrival of the new version PS Form 1412, the Material Distribution Center (MDC) will destroy or recycle all previous editions of PS Form 1412 and use the March 2007 edition.

## Expiration of Local Stamp Consignment Agreements

Effective April 28, 2007, Post Offices ${ }^{\text {™ }}$ and postal retail units will no longer use account identifier code (AIC) 095, Stamps on Consignment Replenishment Sales, to report stamps on consignment sales. AIC 095 will be deactivated and placed on reserve list to assist offices with the closure of stamp accountabilities after many of the local consignment agreements expire. The expiration of local stamp consignment agreements was authorized by Headquarters Corporate Supply Management with a memo dated December 2, 2004, with the subject of Rescission of Delegation of Authority - Local Stamp Consignment Agreements.

## Legally Terminating Agreements

1. Post Offices and postal retail units must not attempt to close any remaining local agreements. Post Offices and postal retail units must notify the Stamps on Consignment Program Office via e-mail (Stamps on Consignment program) of any remaining local stamp consignment agreements.
2. The Stamps on Consignment Program Office will provide local Post Offices and postal retail units with directions and additional communication on what procedures will be taken to notify the consignee of the legal closure of the local Stamps on Consignment agreement.

## Closing Out Stamp Credits

Once the legal termination process has been completed and the Post Office and postal retail units have received any funds for any outstanding amount and/or return of unused stamps, the unit must close all stamp credit accountabilities related to these Stamps on Consignment. To properly close out these Stamps on Consignment stamp credits, each individual office must determine how these stamp credits are accounted for at their units. These may be accounted for as part of the unit reserve stamp stock or as an individual credit.

## Unit Reserve Stock Consignment

For consignments that are accounted for as part of the unit reserve stock, upon receipt of funds and/or unused stamps, the unit reserve custodian must do the following:

1. Ensure the amount matches the pending amount in the agreement.
2. Physically include the stamps as part of the unit reserve stock.
3. If funds are received, issue funds to a retail associate as a stamp requisition using PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return:
a. The retail associate will enter the amount on their PS Form 1412, Daily Financial Report, into AIC 841, Stamp Stock Received.
b. Enter the amount into AIC 090, Postage Stock Sales.
c. Remit the amount as a bank deposit.

Individual Credit Consignment
For consignments that are accounted for as an individual credit, the supervisor, upon receipt of funds and/or unused stamps, must do the following:

1. Ensure that the amount matches the pending amount in the agreement.
2. Enter the amount of the funds received in the individual credit PS Form 1412 into AIC 090, Postage Stock Sales.
3. Remit the amount as bank deposit.
4. Enter the stamp portion in the individual credit PS Form 1412 into AIC 848, Stamp Stock Returned.
5. Return stamps to the unit reserve custodian.
6. Ensure that the closing balance for the individual credit accountability (AIC 853) is zero.
7. Perform a final PS Form 1412 for this individual credit.
8. Completely close out or deactivate this individual credit.

## New Offset AICs for Retail Floor Stock and Vending Overages or Shortages at POS ONE Offices

Effective March 1, 2007, new account identifier codes (AICs) have been created as offset accounts to overages or shortages recorded for retail floor stock credits and vending stock credits. After the new POS ONE System Software Release 26.0 is downloaded to POS ONE at your unit, retail floor stock and vending stock credit overages or shortages will no longer offset to postage sales.

When posting retail floor stock counts and vending stock credit counts in POS ONE, the results of the count will post to the appropriate overage or shortage AIC account. Subsequently, POS will automatically offset the overage to the corresponding new assigned AIC or the shortage to the corresponding new assigned AIC. These new assigned AICs will adjust stamp stock credit accountability to the amount as counted.

The following are the assigned AICs:

- AIC 699, SIA, Vending, and APC Stock Overage Offset.
- AIC 843, Stock Adjustment Overage.
- AIC 299, SIA, Vending, and APC Stock Shortage Offset.
- AIC 849, Stock Adjustment Shortage.


## Retail Floor Stock count posted in POS

Overages will continue to be reported in AIC 239, Retail Floor Stock Overage, and will automatically offset to the following AICs:

- AIC 699, SIA, Vending, and APC Stock Overage Offset.
- AIC 843, Stock Adjustment Overage.

This will adjust the vending stock credit accountability to the amount as counted.

Shortages will continue to be reported in AIC 639, Retail Floor Stock Shortages, and will automatically offset to the following AICs:

- AIC 299, SIA, Vending, and APC Stock Shortage Offset.
- AIC 849, Stock Adjustment Shortage.

This will adjust the vending stock credit accountability to the amount as counted.

## Vending Stock count posted in POS

Overages will continue to be reported in AIC 175, Vending Machine Overage, and will automatically offset to the following AICs:

- AIC 699, SIA, Vending, and APC Stock Overage Offset.
- AIC 843, Stock Adjustment Overage.

This will adjust the vending stock credit accountability to the amount as counted.

Shortage will continue to be reported in AIC 612, Vending Machine Shortage, and will automatically offset to the following AICs:

- AIC 299, SIA, Vending, and APC Stock Shortage Offset.
- AIC 849, Stock Adjustment Shortage.

This will adjust the vending stock credit accountability to the amount as counted.

## Managing Employee Items in POS ONE System Offices

Upon installation of new software Release 26.0 for the (point-of-service) POS ONE system during March and April 2007, POS ONE Post Offices ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ and postal retail units will no longer be required to maintain a manual record of unresolved employee items. New functionality in the POS ONE system allows for each unit to maintain and manage financial items that employees are accountable for and that must be cleared or settled at the local unit level. The following account identifier codes (AICs) are employee items:

- AIC 754, Emergency Salary Issued.
- AIC 755, Emergency Travel Advance Issued.
- AIC 068, Employee Cash Overage.
- AIC 764, Employee Cash Shortage.
- AIC 057, Employee Stamp Credit Overage.
- AIC 767, Employee Stamp Credit Shortage.

Whenever an employee item is created or established at the Post Office or postal retail unit, a reference number is automatically assigned to each individual employee item and the employee item is maintained in the Unresolved Employee Items module in the POS ONE system with the assigned reference number. A receipt with the reference number and amount of employee item is issued to the employee, owner of the employee item, which allows for the employee to clear or resolve the employee item.

Consequently, when an employee item is to be cleared or resolved, the employee will use the reference number.

If the reference number is not available, then the unit supervisor can search and provide the reference number so the employee can clear the full amount or partial amount of the unresolved employee item. If full amount is paid, the employee item will be removed from the Unresolved Employee Items module. If partial amount is paid, the balance amount will remain as pending in the Unresolved Employee Items module, until completely cleared.

The Unresolved Employee Items module in POS ONE will maintain the details of all pending employee items to be resolved by the unit. It is the responsibility of the postmaster, manager, or supervisor to pursue collection of employee debt and clear unresolved employee items on a timely basis while adhering to the National Agreement; Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) 450, Collection of Postal Debts from Non-bargaining Unit Employees; ELM 460, Collection of Postal Debts from Bargaining Unit Employees; and the Debt Collection Act.

The unit supervisor must reconcile the amounts in the unresolved employee items with the Customer Trust and Employee Items in the weekly Narrowcaster report, which has the employee items balance.

Don't endanger yourself, your family, your employer, or those around you by allowing yourself to be distracted by phones, mail, BlackBerry devices, scanners, or anything else.

Take the time to pull over or wait to answer that beep or ring tone until you reach your destination.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:

- When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
- When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
- There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.
These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card, or online at http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/ security.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.
Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.
B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use - Exempt from Customs Requirements."
B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. Exceptions: All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/ FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot. 22 caliber rifle per individual.
G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.
H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
L. All official mail is prohibited.
M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
N. Registered mail is prohibited.
O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

## Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

## International Business

## Incorrectly Addressed APO/FPO Mail

All acceptance personnel are reminded that mail addressed to an APO or FPO address should not list the country name.

APO/FPO mail is destined to the military post office. However, an address that includes a country name is sent to the international post office, which is not the correct destination.

Below are examples of correct and incorrect addressing:

The Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ will issue a nondenominated FirstClass Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ definitive, Forever Stamp (Liberty Bell) on April 12, 2007, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The stamp, designed by Carl T. Herrman of Carlsbad, California, also goes on sale nationwide April 12, 2007.

The value of the Forever Stamp (Liberty Bell) will always be the First-Class Mail single-piece 1-ounce letter rate that is in effect on the day of use (mailing), unaffected by any future rate changes.

The stamp depicts the Liberty Bell, which is perhaps the most prominent and recognizable symbol associated with American independence. Over the years, the historic significance of the bell's message has transcended our national borders, and today the Liberty Bell is an international icon of freedom.

## How To Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office ${ }^{\text {TM }}$, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, and at The Postal Store ${ }^{\circledR}$ Web site at www.usps.com/shop.

Customers may submit \#6 or \#10 covers constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ recommends 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free envelopes, $9 / 16$ " side seams with no glue on the flap. There is a minimum of 10 covers at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. You may submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. Two test envelopes must be included. For covers with graphics or lettering, please note the maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. The Postal Service reserves the
right not to accept hand painted and other cachets that are not compatible with our digital color postmark. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of non-specified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark. All orders must be postmarked within 60 days of the first day of issue date.

They should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to the following address:
