## Background

The 2020 primary season is here and the Postal Service ${ }^{T M}$ is preparing for the November 2020 general election. In addition to the Presidential election, there will be numerous congressional, gubernatorial, state, and local races. Thus, proper handling of Election Mail and Political Mail is critical.

Concerns have been raised about how long it takes for Election Mail and Political Mail to reach voters. The Postal Service takes these concerns very seriously. Coast to coast, plans are in place to ensure the timely receipt, processing, and delivery of Election Mail and Political Mail.

Generally, citizens use one of the following methods to cast their votes:

- In person at a traditional polling place via electronic or paper ballot on or before Election Day, or
- Through the mail via an absentee paper ballot

Although most votes are cast at traditional polling places, voting by mail is increasing in popularity across broad segments of the American electorate. The Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has accelerated this trend for spring and summer elections. Since March 2020, several states have taken legislative, executive, and administrative action to delay or cancel elections, as well as expanding access to absentee voting and other forms of voting by mail. In the 2018 midterm election, 25 percent of voters cast ballots by mail, and more voters are expected to do so during the 2020 election cycle in light of the recent changes related to COVID-19.

## Key Dates

- The primary and caucus season began February 3 in lowa and will continue through July.
- Congressional run-off elections are scheduled throughout the summer.
- The general election will be held on November 3.


## Key Elections

## General Election - November 3

- A total of 470 seats in the U.S. Congress are up for election:
- 35 Senate seats - AK, AL, AR, AZ, CO, DE, GA (2), IA, ID, IL, KS, KY, LA, MA, ME, MI, MN, MS, MT, NC, NE, NH, NJ, NM, OK, OR, RI, SC, SD, TN, TX, VA, WV, and WY.
- All 435 House seats and 6 non-voting seats representing American territories and the District of Columbia.
- Due to retirements and deaths in Congress, certain special elections will be held in AZ, CA, GA, MD, NY, and WI throughout the year.
- 11 Gubernatorial seats - DE, IN, MO, MT, NC, ND, NH, UT, VT, WA, and WV.
- Numerous state and local elections. See the chart on page 9 for details.


## Election Mail and Political Mail Overview

## What is Election Mail?

Election Mail is any item mailed to or from authorized election officials that enables citizens to participate in the voting process, such as balloting materials, voter registration cards, absentee applications, and polling place notifications.

## What is Political Mail?

Political Mail includes Political Campaign Mail and Political Message Mail.

- Political Campaign Mail is any material mailed at First-Class Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ or USPS Marketing Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ prices for political campaign purposes by a registered political candidate, a campaign committee (federal, state, or local), or a committee of a political party (e.g., Democratic National Committee or Republican Congressional Campaign Committee) to promote political candidates, referendums, or political campaigns.
- Political Message Mail is any material mailed at FirstClass Mail or USPS Marketing Mail prices by a political action committee (PAC), super-PAC, or other organization engaging in campaign activity, issue advocacy, or voter mobilization.
Political Mail may be sent for any public election - partisan or nonpartisan - for which there is a ballot. Political Mail is identified using red Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing.


## Election and Political Mail Project Plan

The Postal Service 2020 Election and Political Mail Project Plan coordinates strategy with key organizational priorities. The plan objectives are to:

- Educate and inform the public on proper mail handling, key dates, and operational guidelines for Election Mail and Political Mail.
- Reinforce the message that the Postal Service takes its job of delivering ballots and other Election Mail and Political Mail very seriously.
- Ensure the correct use of Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing. Political Message Mail (mailings from certain groups about issue advocacy or voter mobilization) and Political Campaign Mail (mailings from certain groups or individuals related to a candidate, campaign, or referendum) both require the use of Tag 57.
- Ensure the correct use of Tag 191, Domestic and International Ballots. Postal Service employees must correctly identify and process this mail according to the appropriate level of service. Tag 191 may not be used for sample ballots.
- Ensure the correct use of the Official Election Mail logo. It may be used on all Election Mail, including ballots.
- Inform election officials that ballots will be delivered according to USPS ${ }^{\circledR}$ service standards. Educate the officials on service standards so they can ensure ballots are mailed and returned by the deadline.
- Ensure Postal Service employees know that they must always promptly and efficiently handle Election Mail or Political Mail with equal care and attention.


## Key Messages

Mail is an increasingly important part of U.S. elections. Throughout the 2020 election cycle, it's important to keep the following in mind:

- U.S. Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ services are a vital part of the U.S. election process. The Postal Service will ensure the dependable and timely delivery of Election Mail and Political Mail.
- The Postal Service takes pride in the popularity of U.S. Mail as an efficient and effective means for citizens to participate in the voting process.
- Customers can trust the Postal Service to deliver their mailed ballots in a timely manner.
- The Postal Service offers a state-by-state outreach program to ensure election boards, political candidates, and mailers are aware of the appropriate procedures and important deadlines to help ensure the proper processing and delivery of Election Mail and Political Mail.
- The Postal Service expects to handle millions of ballots this election cycle - proof that mail is a dependable and protected way to cast a vote.
- Voter communication ensures that ballots have sufficient time to be processed, delivered, and counted.
- The Postal Service suggests that election officials provide voters with guidelines for returning marked ballots with mailing timelines in the balloting materials packet to ensure timely delivery. Return by mail dates are based on state and local laws, but the Postal Service recommends the following:
- Domestic non-military voters are advised to mail ballots at least 1 week before the due date to account for any unforeseen events or weather issues.
- Military personnel serving overseas, such as Army Post Office/Fleet Post Office (APO/FPO) voters, must follow the return by mail date for their location (see fvap.gov/eo/overview).


## Key Voter Message - Mailed Return Ballots

Customers who opt to vote through U.S. Mail service must understand their local jurisdiction's requirements for timely submission of absentee ballots, including postmarking requirements. Voters must contact their local election
officials for questions about local deadlines. The Postal Service recommends that voters mail their ballots at least 1 week before the due date to account for any unforeseen events or weather issues.

## Key Election Official Message - Ballots

Whether using First-Class Mail or USPS Marketing Mail service, customers are encouraged to work closely with local Postal Service election mail coordinators to determine delivery times for the mailings. ## Election Mail

## Absentee Ballots

An absentee ballot is the printed ballot marked by an absent voter, sealed in a special envelope, and returned to election officials, usually in person or through the mail.

Each election cycle presents a different set of parameters for ballot creation and for the size and weight of the return mailpiece. As a result, many voters do not know the correct amount of postage required to return their ballots by mail. Election officials must consult with a Postal Service Business Mail Entry manager, mailpiece design analyst, or election/political mail coordinator to determine the proper postage required for mailing ballots to voters and for voters mailing ballots back to election officials.

Election officials are required to indicate in a prominent location the proper amount of First-Class Mail postage that must be applied to balloting materials for any election, whether sent in hard copy or electronic formats. An exception may apply in certain circumstances for balloting materials for military and overseas voters or where postage is prepaid. See Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM ${ }^{\circledR}$ ), section 703.8.1, to learn more about the postage marking requirements.

## Absentee and Early Voting

As reported by the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL), most states have a method for eligible voters to cast ballots before Election Day, either during the early voting period or by requesting an absentee ballot. However, several states require a reason to request an absentee ballot.

States typically offer three ways for voters to cast a ballot before Election Day:

1. Early Voting. In most states, any qualified voter may cast a ballot in person during a designated period before Election Day. No excuse or justification is required.
2. Absentee Voting. All states will mail an absentee ballot to qualified voters who request one. The voter may return the ballot by mail or in person. It is up to the individual state if a reason is required to vote absentee.
3. Mail Voting. In all-mail election states, a ballot is automatically mailed to every eligible voter (no request or application is necessary). In-person voting sites may also be available. A handful of states use all-mail elections for at least some types of elections.

## Vote-By-Mail

According to the NCSL, several states have provisions allowing certain elections to be conducted entirely by mail. For these elections, all registered voters receive a ballot in the mail. Typically, the voter marks the ballot, puts it in a secrecy envelope or sleeve, places it into a separate mailing envelope, signs an affidavit on the exterior of the mailing envelope, and returns the envelope via mail or by dropping it off at a designated site.

Ballots are mailed in advance of Election Day so voters have an "election period" instead of a single day to vote. All-mail elections, known as Vote-By-Mail elections can be seen as absentee voting for everyone.

Five states, including Oregon (2000), Washington (2011), Colorado (2013), Hawaii (2019), and Utah (2020), hold Vote-By-Mail elections. Voters return marked ballots by mail or at a drop-off location, and in some cases, vote in person at voter centers.

In California, some counties are currently permitted to conduct all-mail elections. After 2020, the option will be available to all counties in the state. Other states permit allmail elections in certain circumstances, such as for special districts, municipal elections, when candidates run unopposed, or at the discretion of the county clerk. Some states have opted to conduct Vote-By-Mail elections for an increasing number of contests in 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Generally, states begin providing Vote-By-Mail elections only in certain circumstances, and then add additional opportunities as citizens become familiar with procedures. For more information, visit ncsl.org/research/ elections-and-campaigns/all-mail-elections.aspx.

## Military - APO/FPO/DPO

## Key Messages

Even in times of war, the Postal Service has delivered the most fundamental symbol of democracy - a ballot. As the election season progresses, emphasize the following key messages:

- The Postal Service is honored to provide the brave men and women serving abroad in the military with the opportunity to vote.
- Any American voter living overseas can mail his or her completed ballot back to the United States free of charge at the nearest American embassy, consulate, or Diplomatic Post Office (DPO). If the voter has authorized access to a military base, he or she can mail a ballot free of charge at the nearest Army Post Office (APO) or Fleet Post Office (FPO).
- For the 2020 general election, special procedures for APO/FPO/DPO absentee ballots are in effect between September 1 and November 30. During this time, the Postal Service will provide special handling for dispatch via the International Service Centers (ISCs).
- The Postal Service recommends military voters visit fvap.gov/eo/overview for return ballot mailing dates.
- The Postal Service is temporarily suspending international mail acceptance for certain destinations due to service impacts related to the COVID-19 pandemic. However, unless otherwise noted, service suspensions to a particular country do not affect delivery of military and diplomatic mail. ## Military - APO/FPO/DPO Absentee Ballots

The Postal Service and the Military Postal Service collaborate to provide special handling of absentee ballots to overseas military personnel. The Postal Service is committed to ensuring that everyone who votes by mail experiences an efficient process.

Here is a summary of special procedures for APO/FPO/ DPO absentee ballots:

- Election officials must mail absentee ballots at least 45 days before the November 3 election.
- All military absentee ballots mailed by election officials from September 1 through December 8 will be subject to special handling procedures.
- Local election offices must segregate military absentee ballots to the Chicago ISC and the Miami ISC gateways. At ISCs, absentee ballots receive special handling, including accelerated sortation, special tray identification, and priority transportation.
- APO/FPO absentee ballots will be sent from local Post Office ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ locations to the nearest Processing and Distribution Center for further handling. Postal Service employees may identify trays or containers of absentee ballot mail using Tag 191, Domestic and International Ballots, and present them to the Post Office facility.


## Military - APO/FPO Returning Absentee Ballots

Military personnel with APO/FPO addresses can return absentee ballots via Priority Mail Express ${ }^{\circledR}$ using Label 11DOD, DOD Express Mail Label Absentee Ballot. The label includes "Waiver of Signature" and "Guaranteed by End of Day" endorsements, so ballots can be delivered the day they arrive at the destination Post Office.

## Label 11-DOD



Familiarize yourself with the following operational guidelines for Label 11-DOD:

- The Military Postal Service distributes Label 11-DOD overseas.
- The Priority Mail Express ballot label is only for voted absentee ballots mailed from Military Post Office (MPO) facilities overseas.
- Voters may use the label on any size ballot envelope and must always affix it in the upper right corner.
- Voters keep part of the label to use the tracking number to track their ballots.
- At ISCs, absentee ballots receive special handling including accelerated sortation, special tray identification, and priority transportation.
- Overseas U.S. military and civilian citizens must return their absentee ballots via APO/FPO locations.
- The ballots arrive by international transportation at one of the Postal Service gateway offices for Customs clearance and initial processing at select designated offices.
- At these facilities, the mail is processed by postal automation equipment in an initial domestic sort for distribution throughout the United States.


## Service Type Identifiers and Improved Mailpiece Visibility

The Postal Service provides customized Service Type Identifiers (STIDs) specifically for ballots to improve ballot mail visibility. These STIDs have proven instrumental in identifying and tracking ballots on hand and in the mailstream. In addition, STIDs have increased the visibility of outbound/ returning ballot mail within the automation environment, and have enhanced passive identification and tracking of ballot mail.

STID processing leverages Intelligent Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ barcode $\left(\mathrm{IMb}^{\circledR}\right)$ scan data that is available via Informed Visibility ${ }^{\circledR}$ $\left(I V^{\circledR}\right)$ reports. ## Election and Political Mail Map

The interactive Election and Political Mail map provides election officials with contact information for election and political mail coordinators. The interactive map includes Business Mail Entry Unit addresses and phone numbers, and a ZIP Code ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ lookup feature to streamline the resource identification process. ## Tag 191



## Tag 191

Tag 191, Domestic and International Ballots, is a green container tag used by election officials to identify trays and sacks of ballot mail destined for either domestic or international addresses. The tag (shown left) provides greater visibility to ballot mail during Postal Service handling. Election officials can order Tag 191 online at usps.com/electionmail and have it mailed directly to local election officials.

## Business Reply Mail and Qualified Business Reply Mail

Business Reply Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ (BRM) and Qualified Business Reply Mail ${ }^{T M}$ (QBRM ${ }^{T M}$ ) are First-Class Mail services that enable election officials to pay the return postage (including a per piece fee) for the ballots returned to election offices.

The mailpieces that election mail officials distribute must conform to a specific format, including use of a unique ZIP $+4^{\circledR}$ code assigned by the Postal Service. Proofs for QBRM must be approved by the Postal Service and bear an IMb. QBRM applies only to automation-compatible cards and letter-size mail weighing no more than 2 ounces. ## Informed Delivery

Informed Delivery ${ }^{\circledR}$ is a secure, free feature that provides eligible residential consumers with a digital preview of their incoming mail and packages. Users can view grayscale images of the exterior address side of automationprocessed, letter-sized mailpieces via email, smartphone app, or an online dashboard. The Postal Service does not open mail or packages to scan the enclosed content as part of Informed Delivery service.

A digital preview of the exterior of Election Mail offers benefits to both election officials and voters. Election officials are able to increase voter interaction with their mail and generate faster response rates. On the other hand, voters have a more convenient and secure "vote at home" experience because they can see when their Election Mail will arrive. Political Mail includes Political Campaign Mail and Political Message Mail. The Postal Service recommends marking Political Mail with red Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing.

## Objectives

In preparation for higher Political Campaign Mail volume for the election cycle this year, the following actions must take place at every postal facility:

- Ensure the correct use of Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing.
- Ensure Postal Service employees know that they must always promptly and efficiently process and deliver Political Mail. Mail entry personnel must ensure that all qualifying mail is documented as Political Mail.


## Key Messages

Millions will use the mail to campaign and vote for their chosen candidate this year. It's also important to note:

- U.S. Mail services are an important part of the U.S. election process. The Postal Service considers the dependable and timely delivery of Political Mail promoting candidates and social causes to be essential to the success of the political mailing season.
- The best campaign is a multi-channel campaign. For candidates, Political Mail can help them reach constituents directly.
- Mail can reach 100 percent of targeted voters.
- Mail prompts action, often through other channels.
- Mail has been tested and is proven effective.

## Tag 57

Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing, is a red container tag used to identify Political Mail while it's in the mailstream. Tag 57 can be used in the following ways:

- In a Political Campaign Mailing by a registered political candidate, campaign committee, and committee of a political party; or
- In a Political Message Mailing by a PAC, super-PAC, or other organization engaging in issue advocacy or voter mobilization.
According to the Postal Operations Manual, a registered political candidate or party is defined as an individual or organization recognized by the appropriate government election control authority (national, state, or local).

## FAQs

## 1. What is Election Mail?

Election Mail is any item mailed to or from authorized election officials that enables citizens to participate in the voting process, such as balloting materials, voter registration cards, absentee applications, and polling place notifications.

## 2. What is Political Mail?

Political Mail includes Political Campaign Mail and Political Message Mail, which are defined as:

- Political Campaign Mail is any material mailed at First-Class Mail or USPS Marketing Mail prices for political campaign purposes by a registered political candidate, a campaign committee (federal, state, or local), or a committee of a political party (e.g., Democratic National Committee or Republican Congressional Campaign Committee) to promote political candidates, referendums, or political campaigns.
- Political Message Mail is any material mailed at First-Class Mail or USPS Marketing Mail prices by a PAC, super-PAC, or other organization engaging in issue advocacy or voter mobilization.

Political Mail may be sent for any public election partisan or nonpartisan - for which there is a ballot. Political Mail is identified using red Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing.

## 3. What is Vote-By-Mail?

Vote-By-Mail refers to elections conducted entirely by mail. A ballot is automatically mailed to every registered voter in advance of Election Day. There are usually multiple ways and locations for voters to return marked mail ballots.

## 4. What is Absentee Voting?

Absentee voting refers to votes cast by persons who are not present at their polling place on Election Day. All states will mail an absentee ballot to qualified voters who request one. The voter must typically return the ballot by mail or in person. It is up to the individual state to decide whether or not a reason is required to vote absentee.

## 5. What are Absentee Ballots?

An absentee ballot is a ballot used by a voter who is unable to be present at the polls on Election Day. The absentee ballot is completed and typically mailed in advance of an election.
6. What is the projected number of ballots the Postal Service will deliver for this year's elections?

According to the 2018 Election Administration and Voting Survey (EAVS), 42.4 million mail ballots (not including ballots sent to and from Uniformed and

Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act voters) were sent by the Postal Service for the 2018 midterm election. Approximately 71.6 percent of these ballots were returned by voters, and the Postal Service anticipates even more ballots will be sent and returned using the mail this year.
7. In the 2018 midterm election, how many ballots were delivered to troops around the world?
The Military Postal Service Agency postmarked and dispatched 13,686 voted absentee ballots from military voters to election offices using Priority Mail Express Military Service between September 1, 2018, and December 10, 2018. The average transit time of ballots to election offices was 5.9 days. APOs and FPOs received 3,648 ballots ( 21 percent) that were Undeliverable as Addressed (UAA) from election offices, with 2,312 redirected to current addresses and 1,336 returned to sender. The 21 percent rate of UAA ballots represents a decline of 12 percentage points from the 2014 election.
8. Is the Postal Service ready for the increased mail volume of Election Mail and Political Mail?
Yes. U.S. Mail services are an important part of the U.S. election process. The Postal Service is confident in its ability to offer dependable and timely delivery of Election Mail and Political Mail.
9. What is the Hatch Act?

The Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. §§ 7321-7326) limits certain political activities for most executive branch employees. For example, the law prohibits employees from engaging in political activity while on duty or in the Federal workplace. The Hatch Act also prohibits executive branch employees from soliciting or receiving political contributions. Employees who violate the Hatch Act are subject to a range of disciplinary actions, including the following:

- Removal from federal service,
- Reduction in grade,
- Debarment from federal employment for a period not to exceed 5 years, and
- Suspension, reprimand, or a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000.

10. How does the Hatch Act affect the Postal Service and its employees?
The Postal Service is non-political, which means the organization cannot and does not support any political party or affiliation over another. The continued effectiveness of this organization depends on delivering all political mailings without giving the perception that the views of one candidate, political party, or political viewpoint are endorsed over another.

It is the responsibility of all Postal Service employees to know and obey Hatch Act restrictions. This means that employees may not display political buttons while on Postal Service property or place bumper stickers on a Postal Service vehicle that indicate a preference for a specific candidate, party, or political position. Employees are also urged not to participate in any political discussions where customers are present.
This brief summary does not address all of the Hatch Act prohibitions. For more information about the Hatch Act:

11. Do the return ballots need to be postmarked by a certain date?
That varies on a state-by-state basis. Some states will accept a postmarked ballot after Election Day in certain circumstances. Other states require a valid postmark for the ballot to be counted. Visit your state's election website for specific information.
12. Do the return ballots need to be postmarked even if there is a meter?

Yes. It is Postal Service policy to cancel all mailpieces within our collection mailstream, including return ballots paid for with metered postage. Consistent with our policy, ballots are postmarked in every state, which helps to ensure that return ballots are postmarked for states that require it.

## DMM Revision: Business Bulk Temporary Forwarding and Hold Mail Service Requests

Effective July 1, 2020, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ will revise Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM ${ }^{\circledR}$ ), sections 507.2.0 and 508.11.0, to include a new option the Postal Service is implementing that will allow business customers to submit a bulk request (10 or more locations) to temporarily forward or hold mail.

This new option allows businesses to provide the Postal Service with a bulk request including the addresses and relevant information for forwarding or Hold Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ services.

Business customers interested in temporarily bulk forwarding or holding their mail must contact their Postal Service field account representative, strategic account manager, or the business service network for assistance.

Although the Postal Service will not publish these revisions in the DMM until July 1, 2020, the standards are effective immediately.

## DMM Revision: Return Receipt for Merchandise

Effective July 1, 2020, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ will revise Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual ( $\mathrm{DMM}^{\circledR}$ ), in various sections to reflect the elimination of return receipt for merchandise service.

The Postal Service requested approval from the Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) to eliminate return receipt for merchandise service. On January 16, 2020, the PRC approved the removal of return receipt for merchandise in Order Number 5408.

In addition, the Postal Service will update Notice 123 Price List and Quick Service Guides (QSG) 150, 250, and 503, and delete Customer Support Ruling 288, to reflect this revision.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: $\$ 1,000$ for domestic, and $\$ 700$ for international Postal Service money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:

- When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
- When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
- When there is discoloration around the dollar amounts, this might indicate the amounts were changed.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card, or online at usps.com/shop/money-orders.htm.
3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Ordxxer Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Mail addressed to military and diplomatic post offices overseas is subject to certain conditions or restrictions of mailing regarding content, preparation, and handling. The APO/FPO/DPO table outlines these conditions by APO/ FPO/DPO ZIP Codes ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ through the use of footnoted mailing restrictions codes (see the Restrictions page following the table).

Acceptance clerks must use the table with the Retail System Software terminal to determine which APO/FPO/ DPO ZIP Codes are active and which conditions of mailing apply.

Such business mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters and printed matter.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.
Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. The returns for the four indexes shown do not include any of these deductions.

## DMM Revision: Seamless Changes for Detached Mail Unit and Full-Service Mailings

Effective July 1, 2020, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ will revise Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM ${ }^{\circledR}$ ), sections 705.22 and 705.23, to include the requirement that detached mail unit (DMU) mailers and mailers who enter full-service mailings at a business mail entry unit (BMEU) participate in the USPS ${ }^{\circledR}$ Seamless Parallel Program by June 1, 2020.

In addition, the Postal Service provides advance notice of its intent to:

1. Require all mailers with an authorized detached mail unit to enroll in the Seamless Acceptance Program by May 1, 2021.
2. Verify all BMEU entered full-service mailings using only automated sampling and verification processes beginning July 1, 2021.
The Postal Service published a notice of proposed rulemaking on January 8, 2020 ( 85 FR 856-859), requiring mailers with authorized DMUs and mailers who enter fullservice mailings at a BMEU to participate in the USPS Seamless Parallel Program by March 1, 2020. In addition, the Postal Service provided advance notice of its intent to require DMU mailers to enroll in the Seamless Acceptance Program by February 1, 2021. Moreover, the Postal Service provided advance notices of its intent to verify all full-service mailings entered at a BMEU using automated sampling and verification processes, beginning July 1, 2021.

Although the Postal Service will not publish these revisions in the DMM until July 1, 2020, the standards are effective immediately.

## IMM Revision: Individual Country Listing for Canada

Effective May 21, 2020, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ is revising Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual $\left(\mathrm{IMM}^{\circledR}\right)$ to reflect a change to the Individual Country Listing for Canada.

In consultation with Canada Post, the Postal Service is adding a restriction to reflect that the Canadian Food Inspection Agency requires a zoo sanitary certificate for all meat-based pet food products.

## Publication 22 Revision: Updates for Expedited Packaging Supplies

Effective April 2020, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ revised Publication 22, Expedited Packaging Supplies, to include the following updates:

- The minimum annual expedited (Priority Mail Express ${ }^{\circledR}$ and Priority Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ ) revenue thresholds have increased for Specialized Packaging and Customized Packaging:
- Specialized Packaging increased from \$50,000 to \$75,000.
- Customized Packaging increased from $\$ 250,000$ to \$350,000.
- Additionally, PS Form 4004-SP, Specialized Packaging Order Form, and PS Form 4004-C, Customized Business Case, have been updated to reflect the new thresholds (with April 2020 edition dates).
- PS Form 3650, Request for Expedited Packaging for Business Reply Mail Use, was created for business customers who wish to purchase Expedited Packaging supplies to use as inserts in their Business Reply Mailings. PS Form 3650 has an edition date of March 2020.

## Cybersecurity is Our Shared Responsibility

At work, each of us conducts official business on behalf of the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$, but vigilance should not stop once we are off the clock. In an increasingly connected world, USPS ${ }^{\circledR}$ employees must incorporate cybersecurity best practices at all times, whether we are in the office or at home.

This is especially important now that our homes have turned into offices due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. Since many USPS employees have been affected by the expanded telework policy, the CyberSafe at USPS ${ }^{\circledR}$ team offers the following tips to protect USPS networks, systems, and resources:

- Defend yourself from phishing scams by being a SHARK:
- (S) Slow down. Be cautious when receiving "urgent" requests.
- (H) Hover. Hover over links to reveal the destination before clicking.
- (A) Ask questions. Is it too good to be true? Is this an unusual request?
- (R) Reach out. If something doesn't seem right, verify the sender's official address. If the sender seems suspicious, report the email to the CyberSafe team.
- (K) Keep sensitive information private. Never share sensitive information based on email requests.
- Create strong passwords. When setting passwords, use a passphrase and change specific letters into special characters or numbers. Add a unique identifier to differentiate passwords (e.g. "B3_Cyb3rS*f3_w0^k"), and don’t repeat passwords across separate accounts.
- Separate for security. Never connect your personal or work devices to USPS computers, equipment, or networks. If you need to charge a device, use an outlet.
- Stay CyberSafe at home. Protect yourself and your family by using secure networks, setting strong and unique passwords, guarding your finances, and protecting your mobile devices.
Cybersecurity is our shared responsibility - it starts with you, no matter where you are. Protect yourself, your family, and Postal Service networks against cyberattacks with the following resources:

## Introducing "Virtual" Grow Your Business Day Events

The Small Business Sales Team members, along with the local districts, are responding to the changing needs of today's small business by introducing a new "virtual" way to hold Grow Your Business Day (GYBD) events.

Using the new format, small businesses will be able to join postmasters in an online forum to share information on the various Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ products and services that businesses need to thrive. These valuable sessions build loyalty by providing customers with tools to assist them to come back even stronger once the crisis is over.

Holding a virtual GYBD event is a great way to check on local businesses and let them know that the Postal Service is here to help them. Here are some tips for holding a successful virtual GYBD event:

- Use Zoom to host your meeting. Hold a rehearsal no more than one day before the event. Use this time to uncover technological issues and learn how to use the Zoom platform.
- Plan the date of your event in advance. Put the date on a spreadsheet and share the information with your Area Headquarters liaison. This will help provide enough time to effectively promote your event.
- Position your meeting as a "thank you" for being loyal customers. No need to have a set presentation for the event - let customers know the event is being held to offer them assistance.
- Use an open "Question and Answer" forum. Let business customers ask the questions and be prepared to provide answers to their specific needs. If there are questions you can't answer, ask these customers to share their contact information via private chat, enter a lead in the Business Connect (BC) portal and have your local Business Development Specialist (BDS) follow up with them.
- If possible, invite your local BDS to attend the event. They can help answer questions and quickly follow up on prospective new business.
- Be prepared to share information. Business customers will need information about Every Door Direct Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ (EDDM ${ }^{\circledR}$ ) to help promote their business, and Priority Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ for order fulfillment and eCommerce.
- Share collateral for these events by sharing your screen. Here are some recommendations for collateral:

1. Pocket postmaster - 17SUPPKTPM01.
2. Shipping collateral - 18BDSGUIDEQ101.
3. EDDM collateral -17SUPSHT761.
4. Political direct mail piece - 16POLMLDM100.

- Document the event and any potential leads in the BC Portal. This is the way to get credit for your Business Connect activities.
- Once the event is over, send GYBD thank you cards to customers. Order GYBD thank you cards from the Material Order site to thank your guests for attending and to keep the Postal Service fresh in their minds:

Stamp Fulfillment Services (SFS) will not make an automatic distribution to Post Offices. To allow postmasters to order the 2020-2021 Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation stamp in quantities approximating customer demand, there is no minimum ordering quantity. Postmasters must review their previous year's sales records to determine the appropriate number of the 2020-2021 Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation stamps to order. Postmasters must order sufficient quantities of Item 336300 to meet the expected demand for this item by stamp collectors, conservationists, and hunters. Post Offices must not sell these stamps before the first-day-of-issue, but will be able to preorder them through SFS Web at sfsweb.usps.gov.

## Distribution: Item 336400, 2020-2021 \$25.00 Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp, PSA Pane of 20

The 2020-2021 \$25.00 Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation PSA Pane of 20 will only be distributed to SFS in Kansas City, MO, and by consignment via Amplex Corporation.

## Return of Unsold 2019-2020 Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamps

Before June 30, 2020, all retail associates must return unsold 2019-2020 Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation stamps (also known as Duck stamps) to the unit reserve. Unit reserve stock custodians must ship unsold migratory bird stamps to the SFS destruction vault during their next scheduled return cycle. All postal retail units are required to return unsold Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation stamps annually.

Locally produced items are not authorized. Only merchandise that has been approved and assigned an item number by Headquarters Retail Marketing may be produced and sold.

On July 1, 2020, in New York, NY, the United States Postal Service ${ }^{\circledR}$ will issue the Hip Hop stamps (Forever ${ }^{\circledR}$ priced at the First-Class Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ rate) in four designs, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 476500). The stamps will go on sale nationwide July 1, 2020, and must not be sold or canceled before the first-day-of-issue. The Hip Hop pane of $\mathbf{2 0}$ stamps may not be split, and the stamps may not be sold individually.

The Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ celebrates hip hop with four new stamps in a pane of 20 . Since its inception more than four decades ago, the electrifying music, dance, and art movement has profoundly influenced American and global popular culture. The stamp art features photographs taken by Cade Martin that depict four elements of hip hop:

- MC-ing (rapping),
- B-boying (break dancing),
- DJ-ing, and
- Graffiti art.

The bold, digitally-tinted images are intended to appear in motion. The words "Forever" and "USA," "Hip Hop," and the name of the element featured appear across the top of each stamp. Art director Antonio Alcalá designed the stamps, which are highlighted with a vivid yellow, green, red, and black color scheme. The title of the stamp issuance, printed in red and black, is centered on the top of the pane.

Stamp Fulfillment Services will not make an automatic push distribution to Post Offices. Post Offices may begin ordering stamps before the first-day-of-issue through SFS Web at sfsweb.usps.gov.

## How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 120 days to obtain the first-day-ofissue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ or at The Postal Store ${ }^{\circledR}$ website at usps.com/shop. They must affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark up to a quantity of 50 . There is a 5 -cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. All orders must be postmarked by November 1, 2020.

The Postal Service also offers first-day covers for new stamp issues and Postal Service stationery items postmarked with the official first-day-of-issue cancellation. ## Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears on the following pages. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office ${ }^{T M}$ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include
postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP $+4^{\circledR}$ Code, as listed next to the postmark.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

## How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 120 days to obtain the first-day-ofissue postmarks by mail. Each cover must have sufficient postage to meet First-Class Mail ${ }^{\circledR}$ requirements. Customers may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office ${ }^{\text {TM }}$, by phone at 800-782-6724, or on The Postal Store ${ }^{\circledR}$ website at usps.com/shop.

## Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit \#6 or \#10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, $9 / 16$-inch side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 inches (vertically) by 4 inches (horizontally). Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers must affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of

## Use the Revitalized Preferred Fuel Network to Save on Fuel Costs

The Postal Service ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ periodically adds new, removes expired, or renews existing Preferred Fuel Network (PFN) agreements. Site Managers and their drivers are asked to support the revitalized PFN brands when discounts at these locations provide a comparable cost per gallon of fuel, as this helps reduce overall fuel costs to the Postal Service. The PFN brands listed in the table shown here provide gallon-based discounts for all fuel purchased from their locations.
