U.S. Postal Service Ready to Deliver for America During the Holidays

The United States Postal Service® (USPS®) and its dedicated employees across the nation are ready to deliver another successful holiday season of outstanding service.

“Our 2022 peak season was a tremendous success,” said Postmaster General Louis DeJoy. “We are ready to deliver for the holidays in a superior and routine manner. We have been planning early and leveraging investments in our people, infrastructure, transportation, and technology, made possible by the Delivering for America™ plan.”

Throughout 2023, USPS has maintained strong service performance while engaging in numerous transformational initiatives across the organization and the country. Additionally, the Postal Service™ is working hard to correct service-related issues in limited areas across the nation through hiring initiatives and improving operational efficiency.

No Holiday Surcharges

The Postal Service has also announced it will not levy any additional surcharges for customers this holiday season, offering increased predictability in pricing. There will be no additional fees for residential area delivery, for Saturday delivery, or for minimum volumes. USPS will continue to be the most affordable way to mail and ship this holiday season.

Key Investments Ahead of 2023 Peak Season

Delivering for America investments in the Postal Service’s workforce, package processing, and delivery operations ahead of the 2023 peak holiday season include:

- **Hiring 10,000 seasonal employees:** The Postal Service has focused on its Delivering for America initiative to stabilize its workforce — converting over 150,000 precareer workers into career positions since October 2020. Due to this success, USPS anticipates the need to hire only an additional 10,000 seasonal employees.
- **Using 348 new package sorting machines:** These new machines are strategic investments in local community postal infrastructure, enabling postal workers to sort and process packages of all sizes more quickly and reliably. To date, the Postal Service has installed 348 new package processing machines across the nation since the beginning of 2021. This includes 100 new sorting machines since last peak season. USPS will install an additional 47 new machines ahead of this holiday season. This is part of the organization’s \$40 billion investment in new technology and facilities under Delivering for America.
- **Increased daily processing capacity to approximately 70 million:** USPS has expanded its daily package processing capacity to approximately 70 million — an increase of approximately 10 million

over last year’s capacity. Since 2020, the Postal Service has nearly tripled its daily package processing capacity. Increased package processing capacity allows for packages to move through the postal network more quickly and eliminates the need for the leasing of temporary annexes.

- **Moving 95 percent of volume via more reliable ground transportation:** USPS has adapted its transportation and logistics processes to handle the high mail and package volumes expected during peak season. The Postal Service continues to move mail and package volume from expensive air transportation to its redesigned ground transportation network. Currently, 95 percent of First-Class Mail and more than 95 percent of First-Class packages are moved through the improved, more reliable ground transportation system.
- **New shipping solution — USPS Ground Advantage®:** This enhanced ground solution provides a simple, reliable, and more affordable way to ship packages this holiday season in just 2–5 business days across the contiguous United States. USPS Ground Advantage provides America’s businesses and the public with a compelling new ground shipping option that leverages the organization’s unparalleled last-mile delivery route system and improves the mail and package postal logistics network.

“We understand the importance of every single package and letter that is sent during the holidays,” said DeJoy. “That is why we continue to adapt and execute on strategies to modernize and transform the Postal Service into the high-performing organization the nation expects and deserves. I am confident in our ability to handle the peak season surge and deliver exceptional service to the American people during the holidays and beyond.”

Military Mail

To send packages to loved ones serving in the military abroad, the Postal Service offers a discounted price of \$21.20 on its largest Priority Mail Flat Rate[®] box. The price includes a \$1.60 per box discount for mail sent to Air/Army Post Offices/Fleet Post Offices/Diplomatic Post Offices (APOs/FPOs/DPOs) destinations worldwide.

Priority Mail Flat Rate boxes are available at no cost at local Post Offices or customers can order them online at

usps.com/freeboxes. Customers may print postage, labels and customs forms online anytime using the Click-N-Ship[®] feature at usps.com/ship.

To ensure timely delivery of holiday wishes by December 25, the Postal Service recommends that you send cards and packages to military APO/FPO/DPO addresses overseas no later than the mailing dates listed in the following table:

Military Care Kit

The Postal Service offers a free Military Care Kit based on the items most frequently requested by military families. The kit contains:

1. Two APO/FPO/DPO Priority Mail Flat Rate boxes,
2. Four medium Priority Mail Flat Rate boxes,
3. Priority Mail tape,
4. Priority Mail address labels, and
5. Appropriate customs forms.

Addressing the Package

- Write out the service member’s full name.
- Include the unit and APO/FPO/DPO address.
- Include the 9-digit ZIP Code™ (if one is assigned).

- Do not write the country name where the service member is stationed in the address.
- Include a return address.
- Inside the box, include the service member’s name and address as well as the sender’s name and address on an index card in case the shipping label gets damaged in transit.



Holiday Stamps

As a reminder, Forever® stamps will always be equal in value to the current First-Class Mail 1-ounce price.

Mail Safely

Effective June 2022, packages containing hazardous materials — in particular, lithium-ion batteries — must be mailed via surface transportation, using USPS Ground Advantage. The requirements are for shipping used electronics and other hazardous materials because items of this nature can cause fires and other dangers to mailers, air carriers, aircraft passengers, and others.

Also, the Postal Service wants to remind customers that *metallic mercury and devices containing metallic mercury* are always prohibited in the mailstream (see about.usps.com/newsroom/national-releases/2023/0629-mercury-remains-prohibited-in-the-mail.htm).

Mailers must now separate all material requiring hazardous markings or labels into identifiable containers. To ensure visibility, these packages must be marked

“Restricted Electronic Device” and “Surface Transportation Only,” in addition to any other applicable markings. Customers are not allowed to use Priority Mail Express, Priority Mail, or Ground Advantage Service to ship pre-owned, damaged, or defective electronic devices — such as cell-phones, laptops, or tablets that contain or are packed with lithium batteries — by air.

Customers can find detailed information on common hazardous, restricted, and perishable materials in Publication 52, *Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail* (pe.usps.com/text/pub52/welcome.htm).

Custom Solutions for Sending Holiday Packages

The Postal Service is uniquely qualified to deliver the holidays by offering a variety of custom solutions designed to make sending holiday packages easy:

- The Postal Service will offer an expanded package delivery window — including early evening and Sundays, where volume warrants.
- Packages that have stamps as postage and are more than a half-inch thick and/or weighing more than 10 ounces *must* be taken to a retail counter for drop-off. Alternatively, customers can use a self-service kiosk for a postage label and drop off the package in a Post Office package slot, *not* a mail slot.
- Get free Priority Mail and Priority Mail Express boxes and envelopes in Post Offices or online at usps.com/freeboxes.
- Skip the line and use self-service kiosks located in larger Post Offices to weigh, pay for postage, and deposit your packages.
- Use the Click-N-Ship feature online at usps.com/ship to create shipping labels with USPS Tracking®, pay postage, or use flat rate shipping products to avoid weighing packages.
- With free Package Pickup, your package can be handed to your mail carrier on his or her regular delivery route or you can schedule a pickup. For details on availability, visit usps.com/pickup.
- Customers can also take any package to the retail counter at any Post Office.

Custom Solutions to Help with Receiving Holiday Packages and Mail

The Postal Service also offers a variety of custom solutions designed to make receiving holiday packages more convenient:

- Informed Delivery® is a free service from USPS that shows you preview images of incoming mail, as well as status updates about your incoming and outbound

packages. You can see those notifications in a morning Daily Digest email, or at any time via the dashboard from your phone, computer, or the USPS Mobile® app. Informed Delivery also has other features that make tracking and receiving your packages easier and more convenient. For more information, visit informedelivery.usps.com.

- USPS Hold Mail® service can hold your mail safely at your local Post Office facility until you return for up to 30 days. For more information or to initiate a Hold Mail request, customers can visit usps.com/manage/hold-mail.htm.
- Customers who know they won't be home when a package is delivered can use USPS Package Intercept® (usps.com/manage/package-intercept.htm). Before delivery, most domestic package shipments can be redirected back to the sender, to a new address (such as a neighbor), or to the Post Office to be held for pickup.

Helping Customers Avoid a Shipping Delay

There are a number of things that customers can do to ensure their holiday mail gets delivered safely and correctly:

- Print addresses clearly and include all address elements, such as apartment number or PO Box™ number, and directional information, as applicable (e.g., 123 S. Main St., Apt. 2B).
- Don't send materials that are prohibited, such as fireworks, ammunition, or devices containing metallic mercury. This includes antique items such as thermometers, barometers, blood pressure monitors, and similar devices. Hazardous materials, such as perfumes, aerosols, or lithium batteries are mailable with restrictions. For more information, visit about.usps.com/newsroom/national-releases/2023/0629-mercury-remains-prohibited-in-the-mail.htm.
- Items powered by dry-cell batteries sometimes turn on during handling and emit a light, buzz, beep, or tick. Ensure your device is powered off or package batteries separately (preferably in the original manufacturer's packaging). **Note:** Specific packaging requirements apply to lithium batteries. For more information, see Publication 52, *Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail* (pe.usps.com/text/pub52/welcome.htm).
- Place a card inside the package that contains the delivery and return address. This ensures the package can be delivered or returned if the mailing label gets damaged or falls off.

- Never guess a ZIP Code. NO ZIP is better than a WRONG ZIP. Look up a ZIP Code at tools.usps.com/zip-code-lookup.htm under Quick Tools.
- Include both “to” and “from” information on packages and only on one side.
- Do NOT reuse mailing boxes — they weaken in the shipping process.
- Select a box that is strong enough to protect the contents. Priority Mail and Priority Mail Express boxes are free at local Post Offices.
- Leave space for extra cushioning inside. Stuff glass and fragile, hollow items like vases with newspaper or packing material to avoid damage. When mailing framed photographs, take the glass out of the frame and wrap it separately.

Holiday Hiring

The Postal Service will be hiring seasonal employees across the country to meet operational needs and the needs of our customers. Hiring decisions are made at a local level. In addition to seasonal hiring, the Postal Service is hiring year-round. Go to usps.com/jobs to apply.

Employee Tipping

All Postal Service employees, including mail carriers, must comply with the Standards of Ethical Conduct for Employees of the Executive Branch. Under these federal regulations, carriers may accept a gift worth \$20 or less (this includes store, restaurant, or mall gift cards). However, carriers must never accept cash and cash equivalents, such as checks or gift cards, that can be used like credit cards (with Visa, Mastercard, or American Express logos) for any amount.

Carriers and Dogs

The Postal Service asks customers to place their dogs in a separate room before opening the front door to accept packages from carriers. Dogs are protective in nature and have been known to jump through screen doors and squeeze through door openings. More than 5,800 carriers were attacked by dogs last year. USPS wants everyone to get home safely each day. Get the North Pole Postmark on Your Holiday Greetings

To help friends and family get into the holiday spirit, the Postal Service offers the opportunity to get a North Pole Postmark on all your holiday greetings. Follow these simple steps:

1. Personalize greeting cards as usual and insert them into envelopes.
2. Address the envelopes and apply the appropriate postage (such as one of the seasonal Forever stamps) to the envelopes.
3. Put all the stamped envelopes in a larger envelope or a Priority Mail box.
4. Put appropriate postage on the larger envelope or box and take to a Post Office for mailing.

5. USPS recommends putting your greetings in the mail by December 1. This will help ensure that the cards and letters can be received in Anchorage, AK, in time to postmark the stamp and get them back in the mail-stream by December 25.
6. If customers miss the December 1 deadline, use Priority Mail Express and send cards to:

Get an “Official” Letter from Santa for Children

Note: Getting a letter from Santa is NOT the same as USPS Operation Santa.

Help children receive written responses from the big guy at the North Pole. Follow these simple steps to get a letter from Santa, complete with a North Pole Postmark:

1. Have your child write a letter to Santa and place it in an envelope addressed to Santa Claus, North Pole.
2. Later, when alone, open the envelope and write a personalized response to the child on the back of the letter. Don't forget to sign it from Santa!
3. Insert the response letter into a separate envelope and address it to the child.
4. Add the return address to the envelope: Santa Claus, North Pole.
5. Affix a First-Class Mail stamp to the envelope.
6. Place the complete envelope into a larger envelope (preferably a Priority Mail Flat Rate envelope) with appropriate postage and address it to:

Effective October 29, 2023, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®), Exhibit 252.22, to reflect that Electronic USPS Delivery Confirmation International service (E-USPS DELCON INTL®) is available to Chile and Spain (as of October 29, 2023, for both).

IMM Revision: USPS-Produced Packaging

Effective October 19, 2023, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®), section 121.1, to align with *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), section 601.6.1, to reflect that USPS-produced packaging is not eligible for shipping mailable dangerous goods or live animals.

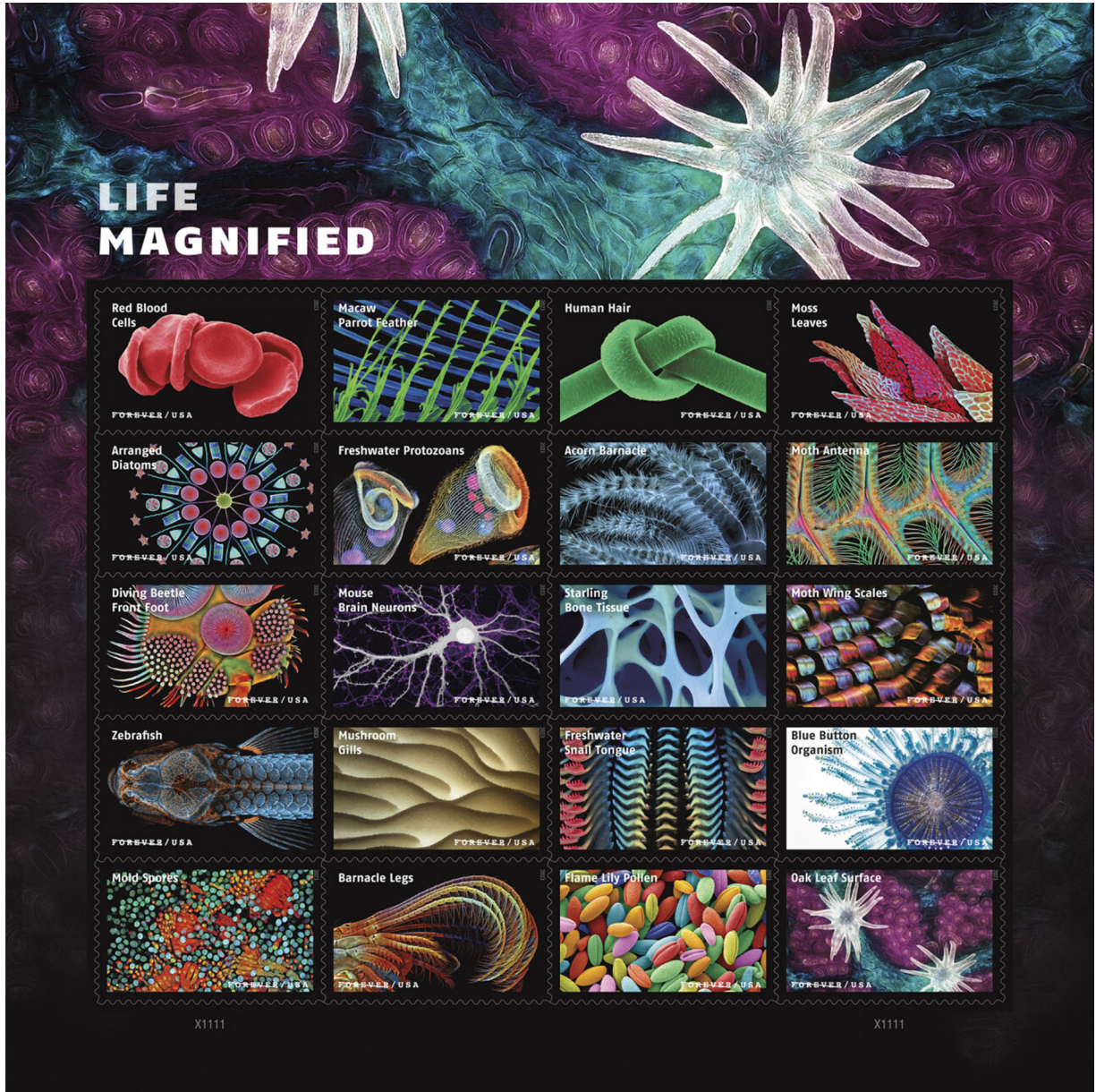

PS Form 2574 Revision: Resignation/Transfer from the Postal Service

Effective April 2023, the Postal Service™ revised PS Form 2574, *Resignation/Transfer from the Postal Service*, to update and streamline the essential information necessary to process a resignation or transfer from the Postal Service into another federal agency.

The following revisions were made:

- Updated Privacy Act Statement.
- Added “Personal Email Address” as a contact method, if necessary.
- Isolated “Transfer” and removed “Separation” for clarity.
- For transfers, “email address” was added as a contact method for the gaining federal agency’s Human Resource representative.
- Removed “Pursuing farming” as a reason for resignation.
- Added section for “Employee Signature.”

The use of revised PS Form 2574 is effective immediately. All previous editions of PS Form 2574 are obsolete and must be recycled.

Mailers are expected to label according to these revised lists for mailings inducted on or after the November 1, 2023, effective date through the December 31, 2023, expiration date.

Environmental Management

Required Procedures for Environmental Agency Inspection Visits and Notices of Violation

U.S. Postal Service® (USPS®) policy requires full compliance with all applicable local, state, and federal environmental regulations, and full cooperation with environmental regulators conducting site inspections.

Environmental Agency Inspections and Site Visits

The site installation head *must immediately* report visits and site inspections by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), or any state or local environmental regulatory agency, to the appropriate USPS Environmental Implementation regional manager, regardless of whether the site visit is pre-scheduled or unannounced.

In addition, the site installation head, or his or her designee, *must follow* the guidelines in the *Standard Operating Procedure for Environmental Agency Inspections and Site Visits* at blue.usps.gov/sustainability/environmental/facility-inspection.htm to ensure appropriate support and facility compliance during environmental agency inspections at USPS facilities.

Environmental Notices of Violation and Similarly Entitled Notices

A notice of violation (NOV) or similarly entitled notice, such as a warning letter, request for information, request to show cause, or notice of non-compliance, can be issued to USPS for failure to comply with an environmental regulation. NOV, issued by the EPA or a state or local agency, may occur as the result of a regulatory site visit or inspection.

Contact your respective Environmental Implementation regional manager *immediately*, if your site receives an NOV or similarly entitled action, such as a warning letter, notification of non-compliance, or request for compliance documentation, and send an electronic copy of the notice.

USPS Environmental Affairs Points of Contact

Report an environmental regulatory agency visit or NOV (or similarly entitled notice) by sending an email to the appropriate USPS Environmental Implementation regional manager, who will assign an Environmental Field Support specialist to assist the site:

- For the Processing facilities and Headquarters facilities located within the Eastern processing region (except the Westshores Division and the state of Michigan) and Retail and Delivery facilities located within the Atlantic and portions of the Central (i.e., KY-WV, OH 1, and OH 2) and Southern Areas (i.e., AL-MS, FL 1, FL 2, FL 3, GA, PR, SC, and TN), contact *Nicholas DeCarlo* at nicholas.decarlo@usps.gov.
- For the Processing facilities and Headquarters facilities located within the Western processing region, the state of Michigan, and the Westshores Division of the Eastern processing region and Retail and Delivery facilities located within the WestPac and portions of the Central (i.e., IA-NE-SD, IL 1, IL 2, IN, KS-MO, MI 1, MI 2, MN-ND, and WS) and Southern Areas (i.e., AR-OK, LA, TX 1, TX 2, and TX 3), contact *Judy Wingo-Stalinger* at judy.wingostalinger@usps.gov.

Christmas Pay Procedures for Rural Carriers

The 2023 Christmas period for rural carriers begins Saturday, December 2, 2023 (Week 1, Pay Period (PP) 26-2023), and ends Friday, December 22, 2023 (Week 1, Pay Period 01-2024). During this period, certain timekeeping and pay rules apply. Timekeepers, including postmasters, supervisors, and other employees responsible for rural carrier time and attendance recording, must become familiar with Article 9.2.K., Christmas Allowances and Procedures, of the 2021-2024 USPS/National Rural Letter Carriers' Association (NRLCA) Agreement.

This article describes:

- Types of compensation to which rural carriers are entitled during the Christmas period.
- Related timekeeping procedures and regulations for the Christmas period.
- Special rules that begin with the start of the Guarantee Year (October 7, 2023) and continue through the end of the Christmas period (December 22, 2023).

The preferred method of timekeeping data entry is through the Rural Management Support System (RMSS) web application. The following information provides USPS® guidelines for Rural Carrier compensation during the designated Christmas period. These instructions are designed for Manual Timekeeping and TACS data entry.

Overtime During the Christmas Period

Regular Carriers (Des 71) — FLSA B

Types of Overtime

During the Christmas period, regular rural carriers are eligible for two types of overtime — FLSA overtime and Christmas overtime.

FLSA Overtime

FLSA overtime is paid at all times of the year, not just during the Christmas period. Regular rural carriers are paid FLSA overtime under two circumstances:

- a. Hours worked in excess of 12 hours in a day. If a carrier works more than 12 hours in a day, the amount over 12 is entered in the Daily Overtime block on PS Form 1314.
- b. Hours worked in excess of 56 in a week. These hours are calculated automatically when the total weekly work hours are greater than 56, so no separate entries are required.

Christmas Overtime

Christmas Overtime is paid only during the designated Christmas period. Regular rural carriers are paid Christmas overtime under two circumstances:

- a. Christmas Assistance — This is assistance provided by the regular carrier on his or her relief day. Christmas assistance work hours are entered in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block on PS Form 1314.
- b. Hours worked in excess of the route's evaluation — This is based on the total actual work hours for the week, not on individual days. For example, if a route has a daily evaluation of 9 hours and the regular carrier works 10 hours on 2 days, and 8 hours on the other 3 days, no overtime would be paid. Even though the carrier exceeded the daily evaluation on 2 days of the week, he or she did not exceed the *weekly* evaluation. The weekly evaluation is 45 hours; the carrier worked 44 hours. (See Handbook F-21, part 567, for overtime calculation when leave days are taken during the week and for routes with an evaluation of less than 40 hours.) These hours are calculated automatically, so no separate entries or calculations are required.

Overtime Rate

The overtime rate paid to regular (FLSA Code B) carriers is 150 percent of the carrier's regular rate. The regular rate is determined by dividing the total compensation received for hours actually worked by the carrier since the beginning of the Guarantee Year (not including overtime), by the total number of hours worked since the beginning of the Guarantee Year (not including overtime). This overtime rate is used for both FLSA overtime and Christmas overtime.

Replacement Carriers

Replacement Carriers (Designations 70, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, and 79) are only entitled to FLSA overtime. For these employees, FLSA overtime is paid for hours worked in excess of 40 in a week.

Regular Carriers (Des 71) — FLSA A

Regular carriers whose FLSA code is A are paid for actual hours worked, not evaluated hours. They are paid overtime for hours in excess of 8 in a day or 40 in a week. For FLSA Code A carriers, enter hours in excess of 8 in a day to the Daily Overtime block on PS Form 1314. Hours in excess of 40 in a week are calculated automatically.

Auxiliary Route Carriers

Carriers serving any auxiliary route are compensated at the **hourly rate** for actual hours worked during PP 26-2023 and Week 1 of PP 01-2024. During this period, carriers are not paid the evaluation of the route. Overtime is paid only when the carrier exceeds 40 hours for the week.

Christmas Assistance

Christmas assistance is additional service provided on a rural route during the Christmas period. For regular carriers, Christmas assistance applies only to assistance given by the carrier, on his or her relief day, while a replacement carrier is assigned to work the full route. For replacement carriers, it applies to any assistance provided on a regular or auxiliary route during the Christmas period. Christmas assistance is reported in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block on PS Form 1314 (for regular carriers) or PS Form 1314-A (for replacement carriers).

Regular carriers can perform Christmas assistance only on their relief day. Therefore, only regular carriers assigned to J or K routes may report Christmas assistance. Regular carriers assigned to route types H or M cannot perform Christmas assistance because these route types do not have a relief day. **Note:** In accordance with an Agreement between the parties, regular rural carriers may perform service on Sunday or provide auxiliary assistance on other routes in the office. This is considered FLSA (daily OT), not Christmas assistance.

Examples of Christmas Assistance:

- A regular carrier comes in on his or her relief day and helps the replacement carrier case the route.
- A regular carrier comes in on his or her relief day and carries part of his or her regular route. (Replacement carrier is listed on PS Form 1314.)
- A replacement carrier carries part of a regular route due to heavy Christmas volume.

These are **NOT** examples of Christmas assistance:

- A regular carrier comes in on his or her relief day, and cases and carries his or her regular route.
- A regular carrier works 2 hours beyond the daily evaluation of his or her regular route.
- A regular carrier performs any work while assigned to an H or M route.

1. Daily Overtime — For FLSA B carriers, this block is used **ONLY** to record when the carrier works more than 12.00 hours in a single day. (See Exhibit 5 for use of this block for FLSA Code A regular carriers. This block is not used for FLSA Code P.) Record the total amount of work hours in excess of 12 per day in this box. *Include the amount of daily overtime in the Actual Weekly Hours block.* For example, if the carrier works 10.00 hours each day, Monday through Wednesday, and works 12.50 on Thursday and 13.00 on Friday, the amount entered into the Daily Overtime block is 1.50 and the amount entered into the Actual Weekly Hours block is 55.50. Do not enter a decimal point when entering work hours.

The Daily Overtime block is **NOT** used to record:

- Hours worked in excess of 56 in a week.
- Hours worked in excess of the route’s evaluation.
- Hours worked when the carrier works his or her relief day.
- Additional hours worked by the carrier after completing his or her route (except for those that are over 12 hours for the day).

2. Xmas Assist Work Hours — For FLSA Code B regular carriers, this block is used **ONLY** when the carrier comes in on his or her relief day to *provide assistance*, not to serve the full route. A relief carrier must be listed on PS Form 1314 as the replacement carrier for that day. Do **NOT** include the amount of Xmas Assist Work Hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block.

The Xmas Assist Work Hours block is **NOT** used to record:

- Hours worked in excess of 56 in a week.
- Hours worked in excess of the route’s evaluation.
- Hours worked when the carrier works his or her relief day and DACA Code R, 3, or 5 is entered on the PS Form 1314.
- Additional hours worked by the carrier after completing his or her route.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international Postal Service money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - When there is discoloration around the dollar amounts, this might indicate the amounts were changed.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at usps.com/shop/money-orders.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals, including in their raw, unmanufactured state, are prohibited. Official Mail shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Reserved for future use.

B. Other than for PMEMS and the exceptions listed below, a customs declaration PS Form 2976 or PS Form 2976-A is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, and for all items (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from this ZIP Code. Other than the exceptions listed below, all PMEMS mailpieces (regardless of mail contents or weight) addressed to or from this ZIP Code must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply to known mailers, who for this purpose are defined as follows:

- Business mailers who enter volume mailings through business mail entry units or other bulk mail acceptance locations, pay postage through advance deposit accounts, use permit imprints for postage payment, and submit completed postage statements at the time of entry that certify that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations. Such business mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters and printed matter.
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail." Such agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation, except for any items addressed to an MPO or DPO to which restriction "B2" applies.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.

C1. Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.

C2. E-cigarettes and related products (e.g., nicotine liquids, e-liquids, parts, or supplies) are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as Official Mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Mailers are responsible to ensure that all medicines and vaccines conform to host nation laws.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic, or sexual items are prohibited. Non-authorized political materials are prohibited. Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.

F1. Weapons of any type are prohibited.

F2. Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

F3. Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.

G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Reserved for future use.

I3. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 27 inches.
- Maximum width 14 inches.

T. Mailings of household shipments and case lots of food to or from an MPO require military transportation office approval prior to mailing. Mailings to or from a DPO require pre-approval from the Diplomatic Pouch and Mail Director.

U. Mail addressed to Retirees (Box R) is limited to 16 ounces and up to a 90-day supply of TRICARE medications. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail items, including audio and video media, weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to Official Mail.

U2. Retirees (Box R) are not authorized mail service.

U3. Reserved for future use.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 lbs.

V. PMEMS is not available.

V1. Electronic Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on *USPS.com*. Manual record of delivery may be available upon request.

W. Hermetically sealed packages of meat products bearing USDA certification, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed. 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Cremated remains are prohibited.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail and Priority Mail items only. This restriction also applies to Official Mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

- C.** Collect on Delivery is prohibited.
- D.** Betel nut (Areca catechu) is prohibited.

- Xmas Assist Work Hours — This block is used whenever a replacement carrier provides Christmas assistance. **Do not include the amount of Xmas Assist Work Hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block.**

Work on Relief Days and Use of X Days

During the period from the beginning of the Guarantee Year (October 7, 2023), through the last day of the Christmas period (December 22, 2023) — which includes pay periods 22-2023, 23-2023, 24-2023, 25-2023, 26-2023, and 01-2024 (Week 1) — record relief days worked by regular rural carriers on PS Form 1314, as described below:

- Carriers who work a relief day during this period and who are entitled to a future day off (X day) must be given that X day in the same pay period. Record DACA Code R or 3 on PS Form 1314 for the relief day that is worked, and DACA Code X on the day that is taken off. The Rural Time and Attendance Collection System (RTACS) will not accept any PS Form 1314 that contains a DACA Code 3 or DACA Code R without a corresponding DACA Code X.
- Record DACA Code 5 on PS Form 1314 for the relief day that is worked if an X day is not taken in the same pay period that the relief day is worked or if the carrier is on the relief day work list and selects the option for

150 percent compensation. When DACA Code 5 is entered, the carrier does not receive an X day.

- Carriers may not use any X days that were earned in previous pay periods during this period. RTACS will not accept any PS Form 1314 that contains a DACA Code X without a corresponding DACA Code 3 or DACA Code R.
- Carriers must have a sufficient balance of X days available in order to use an X day. Carriers with a negative X day balance cannot use any X days until the negative balance is erased.

Christmas Period Timekeeping Instructions

A. FLSA B Regular Rural Carriers

- Work on Relief Day — Only regular carriers on J or K routes have an assigned relief day. Any work performed by a regular on his or her relief day must be reported in one of the following ways:
 - Regular carries entire route — If the carrier reports on the relief day and cases and carries

the assigned route (as is done on a scheduled day), enter DACA Code R, 3, or 5 (as appropriate) on PS Form 1314 for that day. If the carrier is due an X day for working the relief day (e.g., DACA Code R or 3 is entered), this X day must be granted in the same pay period. If the X day is not granted within the same pay period, DACA Code 5 must be entered on PS Form 1314.

- b. Christmas assistance — If a relief carrier serves the assigned route and the regular carrier provides assistance on the relief day, record the hours worked by the regular as Xmas Assist Work Hours. If additional Equipment Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is due for work performed on the relief day, enter the mileage traveled in whole miles in the Route Deviation block for the appropriate week. Do **NOT** include these hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block. Enter J or K in the appropriate block on PS Form 1314 if the replacement carrier worked a full day on the route.

B. FLSA Code A Regular Carriers

Regular carriers (FLSA Code A) are paid at the regular rate for all hours worked up to 8 per day and 40 per week, and at the overtime rate for all hours worked in excess of 8 per day or 40 per week. FLSA Code A employees are not entitled to any X days as they are paid for working the relief day (R):

1. Report total hours worked for the week in the Actual Weekly Hours block.
2. If the carrier worked more than 8.00 hours in a day, enter total hours worked in excess of 8 for that day in the Daily Overtime block.
3. If the carrier worked on a scheduled relief day, enter R on the day the carrier worked the relief day and include the hours worked in the Actual Weekly Hours block. The employee is **NOT** entitled to a future X Day.

C. Auxiliary Route Carriers

Carriers serving any auxiliary route are compensated at the hourly rate for actual hours worked during PP 26-2023 and Week 1 of PP 01-2024. During this period, carriers are not paid the evaluation of the route (this includes newly hired RCAs in the first five pay periods of training). The only changes to standard timekeeping procedures for auxiliary routes are when a Designation (Des) 79 provides Christmas assistance on the assigned auxiliary route. (See section E, item 2).

D. Replacement Carriers Assigned to Vacant Regular Routes (Designations 72/74)

1. Designation 72

- a. FLSA B — Procedures are the same as for Des 71 (Regular Carrier), FLSA B.
- b. FLSA A — Procedures are the same as for Des 71 (Regular Carrier), FLSA A.

2. Designation 74

Work on relief day

- a. Carrier worked scheduled relief day:

- (1) Enter R on the day the carrier worked the relief day.
- (2) Include the hours worked in the Actual Weekly Hours block. The employee is **NOT** entitled to a future X Day.

- b. Carrier provided Christmas assistance on relief day:

- (1) Enter the Christmas auxiliary assistance time on PS Form 1314 in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block.
- (2) Do **NOT** include these hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block.
- (3) Enter J or K in the appropriate block on PS Form 1314 if the replacement carrier worked a full day on the route.

E. Replacement Rural Carriers Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants

All replacement carriers serving as Christmas auxiliary assistants are compensated at their regular rate for actual hours worked up to 40 per week, and at the FLSA overtime rate for actual hours worked in excess of 40.

1. Christmas assistance on a regular route:

- a. Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A for each carrier that provides Christmas assistance.
- b. Do **NOT** enter more than one carrier on each PS Form 1314-A.
- c. Submit a separate certificate for each regular route on which the carrier provides assistance.
- d. Report the Christmas assistance hours in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 Xmas Assist Work Hours block.
- e. Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 EMA blocks.

2. Christmas assistance on an auxiliary route:

- a. Assigned carrier (Des 79) provided Christmas assistance on assigned auxiliary route:

- (1) Enter N in the appropriate block in the No Service section of the carrier's PS Form 1314-A for the assigned route.
 - (2) Record hours worked in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block. Only enter Christmas assistance when the Des 79 assists the replacement carrier working the N day.
 - (3) Include EMA hours and miles (not trips) in the total for the appropriate week. Trips may not exceed the number of days worked in the No Service blocks.
 - (4) A replacement carrier is required to cross-foot the card.
- b. Replacement carrier (Designations 70, 73, 74, 75, 76, and 78) provided Christmas assistance on auxiliary route:
- (1) Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A. Enter route number A997. Use this route type and number for overburdened service or Christmas assistance on auxiliary routes only.
 - (2) Report the Christmas assistance hours in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 Xmas Assist Work Hours block.
 - (3) Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles (if applicable) in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 EMA blocks.
 - (4) If Christmas assistance is performed on two or more auxiliary routes in the same pay period, combine all work hours and EMA data on one manually prepared PS Form 1314-A.

F. Postal Employees (Other Than Rural) Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants

Postal Service employees (other than Des 7X) who provide Christmas assistance on rural routes are compensated at their regular rate of pay for actual time worked. Include all work hours using their normal Time and Attendance System (manual timecards or TACS).

Nonrural employees are entitled to EMA payment if a personal vehicle is used. Prepare PS Form 1314-A as

follows (Do **NOT** prepare PS Form 1314-A if a government vehicle is provided):

1. Report the hours worked on the rural routes on PS Form 1230-C, *Time Card*.
2. Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A for EMA compensation. Complete indicative data at the top of the certificate. Use Des/Act 99-0, actual route type and number, FLSA code P, and correct employee and pay period information.
3. Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 EMA blocks.

Important Items to Remember: Rural Carrier Christmas Pay Procedures

- Hours entered in the Daily Overtime block are **always** included in Actual Weekly Hours.
- Hours entered in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block are **NOT** included in the Actual Weekly Hours block.
- Carriers on auxiliary routes are paid for actual hours worked, not the route's evaluation, during the Christmas period.
- During the period from the beginning of the Guarantee Year (October 7, 2023) through the last day of the Christmas period (December 22, 2023), a DACA Code X cannot be entered on a timecard unless there is a corresponding DACA Code R or 3 in the same pay period and the carrier's X day balance is zero or greater:
 - DACA R and 3 require a DACA Code X to be used in the same pay period.
- If Actual Weekly Hours exceed 56 hours in a week, a DACA Code 5 must be used. DACA Code R or 3 are not allowed.
- If a regular carrier works his or her relief day and serves his or her assigned route, this is **NOT** reported as Christmas assistance.
- Second trip is not allowed during the Christmas period.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears on the following pages. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

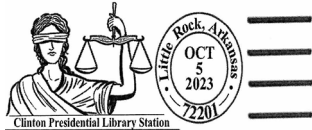
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed next to the postmark.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

The Postmark America® program is designed to feature graphics related to a theme or image that pertains to a specific tourist location, town, or region. The postmark is applied upon request to both outgoing mail and on hand-back philatelic collectibles. These postmarks will be available any day a participating Post Office™ is open. All requests must bear at least minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Customers must present their items for postmarking on or before the official postmark date requested at the address listed in this article.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 120 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. Each cover must have sufficient postage to meet First-Class Mail® requirements. Customers may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by phone at 844-737-7826, or on The Postal Store® website at usps.com/shop.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service™ recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16-inch side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 inches (vertically) by 4 inches (horizontally). Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers must affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of
